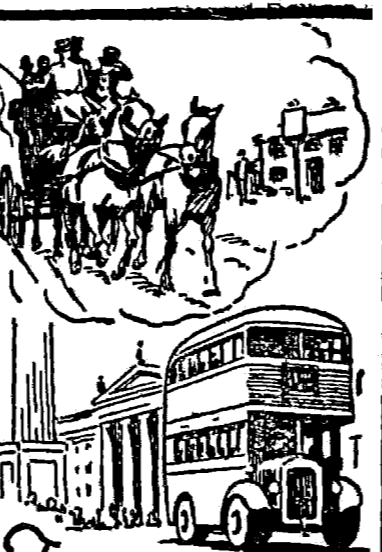
TO FARMERS!
