Electricity Restrictions And Maintenance Of Employment On behalf of the Minister for Industry & Commerce Mr R. C. Ferguson (Secretary of the Department of Industry & Commerce) has sent to the Associated Newspapers and the Irish Master Printers' Association the following:

Department of Industry & Commerce, Kildare Street, Dublin 27th June 1944. A Chára—I am directed by the Minister for Industry & Commerce to refer to a Resolution passed at a joint meeting of the Executive Committee of Associated Irish Newspapers and Irish Master Printers' Association on the 20th instant recommending the members of both Associations to give effect to the wishes of the Minister for Industry & Commerce by retaining their staffs in full-time employment during the period of crisis.

A very progressive step has been taken by the Staff of the L.D.F. in the Dungarvan area in setting up a Committee to provide games and pastimes and facilities to conduct them for the members of the Force. The past five years of drilling and training have no doubt been a strain on the personnel but now that a lighter vein is to be introduced those who fell by the wayside during the hum-drum period will receive a new enthusiasm.

It is intended to form a water-polo team and facilities for other outdoor games will be provided also. For the winter months plans have been made to start a cub exclusively for members and we understand a suitable premises has been located.

It is about time that some amenities were provided for those young men who make up the voluntary army and who have given of their time to learn and train to be good soldiers in Ireland's cause. The ordinary civilian population should be ever thankful to these volunteers and to the Regular Defence Units who have signified their willingness to fight in defence of their country so far thank God we have been spared and may it be so at the end but the people should show their appreciation of the sacrifice made by these men especially the Army when they pass through our town. A soldier's pay is not a princely salary and every penny counts so that these visitors at least as they do ordinary customers last year during the visit of units of the Army complaints were made by Staff Officers that the men were charged heavily for the food they bought. This should not be so and we suggest that in future if the occasion should arise those people who will cater for the men should display a price-card where all can see the different costs for themselves. As we have said the men of the Army and L.D.F. deserve our best thanks and we should do all we can to help them.
