Founder of Christian Brothers' Order Honoured

Dungarvan Joins In Paying Tribute

IN this year of the Lord 1944, the whole Christian World has joined in celebrating the Centenary of the death of Rev Brother Edmund Ignatius Rice, Founder of the Irish Christian Brothers

Naturally, in our own country the celebrations were widespread, as every town in which the Christian Brothers were established wished to show the regard in which this great Irish Congregation is held, and the gratitude due for the wonderful work accomplished during the last 140 years

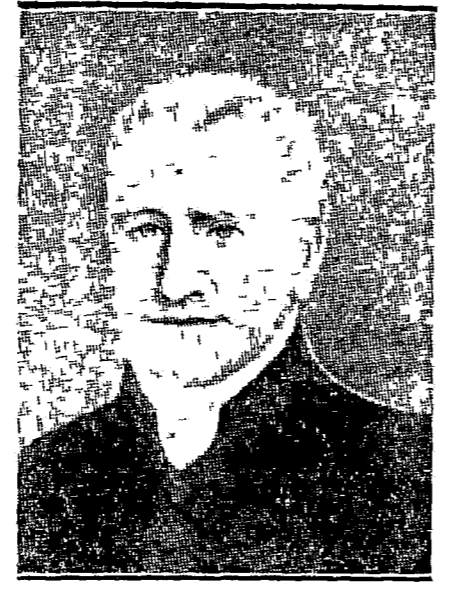

compulsory education it would seem incredible that not so very long ago it was a legal offence for a Catholic to attend a Catholic school and that the master of such a school was liable to a heavy penalty

The story of the Founder and the development of the Order makes an inspiring chapter in our educational and national history

The life story of Edmund Ignatius Rice should be familiar to every citizen of Waterford. He was born at Westcourt, near Callan in 1762 and was the third of six sons

At seventeen years he was apprenticed in Waterford to his uncle a merchant who carried on a thriving import and export trade of which Edmund eventually became manager and sole proprietor

He was now in his prime and blessed with an uncommon blend of physical and mental robustness, which is supposed to be the ideal of perfect education

At the age of forty when he had amassed a considerable fortune he amazed his many friends in Waterford by his project of selling all he had and devoting it to the poor

taken as his name in Religion Brother Ignatius was elected the first Superior-General. This office he held until his seventysixth year

The end came on August 29th 1838, and evoked an extraordinary appreciation of his character and a sympathy with his Order throughout the country

In January 1833, the Brothers returned to their house at Shandon. About this time Dr Foran fitted up the old chapel as a schoolroom for the Brothers

THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS IN DUNGARVAN

THE Old Boro' of Dungarvan has had very intimate connection with Bro Edmund Ignatius Rice and the Christian Brothers from the very infancy of the Congregation

In the year 1807 arrangements were made for the opening of Schools in Dungarvan. A Mr William Barron of Faha in the County of Waterford bequeathed £1,000 the interest of which was to go towards the maintenance of the schools

Soon after his arrival he rented a store in the Main Street in which he opened a school for poor boys and continued teaching there until 1811

The land acquired by the Brothers in Shandon consisted of about seven acres at £2 per acre. This high rent was paid when corn butler etc rated extremely high

About twelve months after the departure of the Brothers, the Parish Priest, Dr Connolly, felt their loss to his Parish, appealed to the Founder to send the Brothers back to Dungarvan, promising to get an annual collection in the Parish for them

Cholera and the Brothers gave up their house and school to the Board of Health as a cholera convalescent home at the desire of their Superior-General Bro E. Rice and that without any remuneration

In January 1833, the Brothers returned to their house at Shandon. About this time Dr Foran fitted up the old chapel as a schoolroom for the Brothers
