Reports from various parts of the country affirm that farmers almost everywhere are busier than ever before in preparing the ground for, and sowing SPRING WHEAT

In times of hurry small things are apt to be overlooked,

but it is well worth while to keep the following points in

- The rate of seeding for Spring Wheat should be about 15-18 stones per statute acre or 24-29 stones per Irish
- If at all possible seeds should be tested before being sown.
- If the germination is less than about 90% the rate of seeding should be proportionately increased
- All seeds should be dressed with a mercurial seed dressing before being
