### Swimming Pool and Water Supply Discussed

### Acting Borough Surveyors Report

Mr J. Ormond Acting BS submitted the following report—General—Housing repairs seem to be keeping on well in spite of considerable work carried out over a number of years and an amount of a little more care on the part of some of the tenants could prevent a lot of damage. I again recommend regular inspections of all Council houses by Rent Collector and reports on how they are kept.

### Water Supply

The supply for the past quarter has been reasonably good though there is still considerable waste and leakage.

### Sewers

For most part the town sewers are in good condition though some sections of old flagged drains are giving trouble. These should be replaced with piped sewers as soon as possible.

### Swimming Pool

The amount of money allowed for Swimming Pool (£840) is now expended and work is closing down in a day or two. A number of further requirements were listed.

### Housing

Maps and particulars required in connection with Compulsory Purchase Order have now been completed and handed to Council's Solicitor with a view to proceeding with Compulsory Purchase.
