The next Qualifying Date under the above Act in Region 2 (province of Munster) will be the 1st June 1945. Persons residing in Region 2 who will be entitled to claim allowances on that date should note the following instructions...

NEW CLAIMS If you are not in receipt of an allowance for the current payment period you should obtain Explanatory Leaflet AL 1 at your local Post Office and apply to the Department of Industry and Commerce on the tear-off slip for Claim Form AL 2...
