## EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION IN DUNGARVAN

On Sunday last the annual Corpus Christi procession took place through the streets of Dungarvan. The weather proved ideal for the occasion and a bright sun shone throughout the event. As in former years large numbers of children, women and men from the various societies participated in the procession and all arrangements for marshalling the large crowd were carried out with perfect precision. The fervour of the processionists and also of the large crowds who lined the streets was inspiring and in keeping with the fine religious tradition of the Old Boro. As usual the streets were beautifully decorated with flags, bunting and flowers and great credit is due to the Communities of the Mercy and Presentation Convents for their successful efforts where beautiful banners suitably inscribed and a number of tableaux were presented by the school children. Punctual at 2.30 p.m. the Abbeyside portion of the procession (Boy Scouts, Children and School Children) and the Women's and Men's Sacred Heart Societies accompanied by Rev. Fr. J. Roche, P.P. and Rev. Fr. M. Power, C.C. marched to Dungarvan to take up their places with the main body of the procession.

At 3 p.m. the procession headed by Rev. Fr. M. Power, C.C. and Kilgobnet Cross-bearer moved off along the usual route and due to the excellent stewarding the great public demonstration of our Faith was completed in an hour and a half.

The canopy was carried by the Brothers of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Blessed Sacrament was borne by Rev. Fr. Canon O'Brien, P.P. assisted by Rev. Fr. R. Keane, Newcastle and Rev. Fr. J. Power, who has recently returned after being 12 years abroad. A Guard of Honour was provided by the Gardai, Southtown under Supt. P. O'Mahony.

Benediction was given at the Square and again outside the Parish Church gates and at which members of the Dungarvan Brass and again under the leadership of Mr. M. Clancy sounded the salute.

## Presidential Election

### MR DE VALERA AT DUNGARVAN

On Sunday last a meeting in support of the Flanna Fail candidate for the Presidency—Mr Sean T. O'Kelly was held in Dungarvan and addressed by Mr de Valera and Mr Little. Prior to the meeting the Portlaoise Pipers Band marched around the Square and then Mr Morrissey, T.D. who presided introduced the speakers.

In the course of a long speech Mr de Valera said that he would be satisfied with his visit to Dungarvan if the people went away from the meeting with the idea that the necessity of reviving the Irish language is vital and most important. During the last elections he said he took the opportunity given him to bring home to the people the need for speaking the language not as a school subject but organically amongst themselves.

He said that despite whatever political or military reverses we had the fact that we had our own language had kept us together and helped us to survive as a nation. If we lost our language we could only be then identified as a province of England.

Giving his opinion on the matter he stated that the man who worked for the language did as good national work as the soldier who went into the field of battle. He appealed to the parents to help the young people by encouraging them to speak Irish and he said that it was the people of his own generation who were responsible for leaving the language die out as it did.

Dealing with the elections Mr de Valera said that they had been accused by the Opposition of trying to bring in dictatorship. This was nonsense for surely if there was any evidence of freedom in the elections Mr de Valera said that they had been accused by the Opposition of trying to bring in dictatorship.

Continuing at length he dealt with the record of Mr O'Kelly during the past 50 years and said that it was the opinion of the Flanna Fail Party that he was the most suitable man for the position.

Before concluding Mr de Valera reverted again to the question of the Irish language and said that unless a sincere and earnest effort was made now the language would be dead in twenty years. He said that he hoped it would not be long until the people would understand him in their own language.

The meeting concluded with the playing of the National Anthem by the Pipers Band.
