SENIOR CLUBS
(By "TAOHLIN")
Sunday was certainly a day of surprises but the greatest of all was the defeat of the County Champions Army by Erin's Own in the senior hurling championship. The game 1-11 to 0-10 was by no means brilliant but a feature was the extraordinary come back by the ex-champions who by their display surprised their most ardent supporters. This set back will surely provide the Army with a lesson and city followers are already looking forward to the Mount-Sion-Erin's Own clash which will be staged at the Sportsfield on August 26th.

Tallow were adamant which resulted in their being awarded the game against Portlawn at the Co Board meeting on Sunday. A more amicable decision could be arrived at but the Tallow representative present at the meeting stated he was only carrying out his club's wishes and had no alternative in his opinion. It seemed strange particularly when at a later stage the Tallow delegates said they would play Portlawn in Cappoquin provided the necessary arrangements were made in a financial affair.

This of course and rightly so was not entertained by the Chairman and Tallow now face Dungarvan in the next round of the championships.

I have heard of hand that Tallow in all probability will meet Portlawn in the championships and general opinion says that they will hardly accept a bloodless victory.

This of course is a matter for the Tallow Club and officials but I would like to state Tallow were awarded the points and match within the rules and this should be plain enough for those who talk about a bloodless victory.

Dungarvan are to have Cappoquin visitors in a senior hurling friendly on Sunday July 29th in connection with the Local Civic Week. This game deserves particular support as it is being played for a very worthy object. This game has received the sanction of the Co Board and I hope the Western Board will do likewise at their next meeting.

The only senior game to be played next Sunday will be between De La Salle and P. H. Pearce at Waterford at 3.30 p.m. I hear De La Salle will be short one of their more than prominent players but they expect to put up a strong team against the Pearce's who will not be at full strength.

Occasionally I look up the rule book and this week I found rule 25 page 55. It says that the reading and perhaps it may prove interesting to members of a particular city club should they decide on looking it up.

I have read a very interesting Dublin Resident Dispatch letter and quite agree on point but when one sees Tipp strong contenders for All-Ireland Honours one wonders if it is youth or experience as required. The Tipp centre-half back won a senior All-Ireland in 1930 and now you have him in 1945 putting more than one promising young fellow in his pocket and it would be no surprise to me to see him win another All-Ireland Medal this year. Other Tipp players who are in the veteran stage are Connolly, Tony Brennan and Tommy Doyle. Tommy Doyle is not a young fellow by any means.

The senior hurling selection are not lax re young home players and non-residents but the selectors seldom get an opportunity of seeing young non-residents in action and you cannot very well select a young player on his adopted county form unless he is very good in the headlines. As for the home youngsters quite a number have been tried out and they did not come up to expectations.

With reference to avoid the idea of getting the man in Inter-County Hurling very often the man gets you and from my own experience we always lacked fighting back methods especially in our attacking department.

However Decie man your letter has been well received down here and one thing I am convinced of is your enthusiasm which is very much in evidence to see Waterford receive the All-Ireland Cup at Croke Park. Regards Taohlín.

The Minister for Industry and Commerce wishes to inform claimants that the practice whereby each claimant was notified on a Form AL 30 when to collect his new allowance book has been discontinued except in cases where an award is being made for the first time or where an award has not been made at the commencement of the new Payment Period.

In future a claimant who holds an allowance book and who is entitled to an allowance during the Payment Period will receive his new book in exchange for the stub of his old book.

All claimants are advised to bring their old books to their local Post Office a copy of Leaflet AL 14 which gives full particulars regarding the change of procedure.

COUNTY WATERFORD

SHEEP BREEDING SCHEME, 1945 For the purpose of improving the breeds of mountain sheep in County Waterford the Waterford Committee of Agriculture are prepared subject to the approval of the Department of Agriculture to locate a limited number of high-grade black-face rams on the commonage areas of the Comeragh Mountains and the Waterford area of the Knockmaldown Mountains on the following conditions—

- (1) The Committee shall grant to each selected applicant a premium of £3 to £8 on the basis that the value of premium shall be less by £3 than the cost of the price of the ram subject to a maximum premium of £8. (2) In the allocation of rams preference will be given to applicants who apply on behalf of sheep owners who are prepared to mate the rams to selected ewes. (3) The Committee will endeavour to secure that only rams of a high standard of quality will be supplied but they cannot undertake responsibility in case any animal should subsequently prove unfruitful or unsatisfactory for breeding purposes.
