Town Hall Charges

Mr T McCarthy presided at a meeting of the Dungarvan Urban District Council held at the Council Chamber, Town Hall on Friday night last. Messrs L A Veale T A Kyne P O Dwyer J Butler M Clancy and N Kelly were present.

Messrs T Moylan, Manager, J O'Dwyer, Surveyor, T C Williams, Solicitor, and M O'Meara, Acting Town Clerk, attended.

On the proposition of Mr Butler seconded by Mr Clancy a resolution striking the town rates as adopted for the current year was passed.

The warrant was duly signed and sealed.

Managers Orders
The Clerk next read a number of orders made by the Manager since July 2nd the most important of which were—

(1) In connection with the report of the Mr P Walsh SSO on inspections on Council houses in which he stated that several tenants were keeping refuse in right-of-ways and one was keeping pigs the Manager ordered that tenants be notified to remove refuse from passageways and that any tenants keeping pigs be notified that steps will be taken to terminate tenancy unless this nuisance is abolished.

(2) The District Nursing Association were applying for a reduction in the rent of the Town Hall for a time in aid of the Association's funds.

Arising from the last special meeting held in connection with the above and at which it was agreed that the Council's solicitor write to the owners of the sites required with a view to purchasing them voluntarily.

Mr Williams solicitor stated that on July 5th he wrote as instructed to Mrs Nugent Mr Moloney and let him have the lowest price at which they were prepared to sell. There was no object in writing to Mr Daniels as his holding had been included in a previous resolution already passed.

On July 10th a reply from Messrs Farrell & Morrissey solicitors on behalf of Mrs Daniels stated that their client wished to point out that she was not prepared to sell the total amount required as it would make her holding uneconomic for houses and another reason.

Dealing with the other offers he stated that Mr Moloney was willing to sell his land at £200 an acre clear and Mrs Hallywell stating that she would sell her interest as tenant for £50.

Mr Veale—There seems to be no way except to pass the Compulsory Order in the whole scheme wide open.

Mr Clancy—We have to face the facts. Houses will have to be built and in order that this may be done people will have to make sacrifices and while I am not a fan of the compulsory purchase order I think that the Council always gave the Association copession as far as the hall was concerned and he thought that the same consideration should be given to the Council.

Mr O'Dwyer—There are so many charitable organisations in the town who use the hall that a definite stand must be made some where.

Mr Clancy—I agree with what has been said and I think that the work of the Nursing Association but I think it is a bad policy to give reductions to anybody as it might cause trouble with other organisations later on. The hall is a business proposition and we are looking for revenue. There are further repairs to be done to it and unless it makes itself pay they cannot be done.

A well-known breeder of Shorthorn cattle has expressed the opinion that it is a sound policy to bring heifers to their first calving as strong as possible not necessarily fat but fit and they should be trained to take feeding Cows when first calved he says seem to make a special effort to be as good as possible to the new calf. We know that during the first fortnight a cow in good condition gives an abnormal percentage of butter-fat so that we must have something in reserve against this special effort in the case of a good maker. Probably the most important time in a cow's life the breeder under notice contends is from the birth of her first calf to the birth of her second calf and she can hardly be fed too well during this time.
