WATERFORD CAMOGIE CONVENTION

Excellent Review Of Year's Work

The Annual Convention of the County Waterford Camogie Board was held at the Court House, Dungarvan on Sunday last January 27th

In his address welcoming the delegates the Rev. President said it is with the greatest pleasure I have come here to preside over the review of such a successful year

The following nominations were made:—(1) Chairman—Miss C. Flynn (Waterford) (2) Hon. Secretary—Miss S. Hogan (Cork) (3) Hon. Treasurer—Miss M. Montayne (Waterford)

That County Finals be played not later than Sept 30th. This was dealt with by Bye-law No. 9

That the team consist of 15 players and the field be lengthened

That referees be requested to study Rule Book

The Chairman pointed out that this was a recommendation rather than a motion and all agreed that referees should be thoroughly conversant with the rules

That the Selection Committee task end with the picking of the County team

That the County team be obliged to enter into strict training under the supervision of appointed trainers

That an amended form that the County team should have as many matches together before championships as finances would permit

That Congress be asked to remove ban on hockey

Referred to Congress From St. Mary's—(a) That the Selection Committee shall consist of 4 members 2 from Co. Champions and three nominated by Co. Board was amended by Bye-law 23—The Divisional Convention shall elect 2 members from the Eastern and Western Divisions and the Co. Champions shall nominate one of these five to constitute the Selection Committee and no member of the Divisional Representatives shall be eligible for a place on County team

That a panel of Lady Referees to be drawn up

That a League should be formed in 1947 as well as Champion ships

That a Juvenile League be formed in both Eastern and Western Divisions to promote the game

That the question of transfer be considered at Convention

Withdrawn as incorporated in Draft Bye-law 23

The Convention then in virtue of Rule 3 page 32 Official Guide made Bye-laws to govern the game in Co. Waterford

The chief point in the Bye-laws was the establishment of Eastern and Western Boards to take charge of their respective areas

These Bye-laws had been drafted by a sub-committee of the Co. Board and the excellence of their work was shown by the fact that out of 32 Bye-laws only 5 were amended or rejected

2 new Bye-laws added to the 32 that they are indeed to be congratulated on an excellent achievement

Munster Convention Elected—Misses Flynn and O'Brien, Messrs Byrne, Harte and Fanning

Election of three delegates to Annual Congress—Misses Flynn, Montayne and Mr P. Fanning

The representatives elected to the Munster Council were—Miss C. Flynn and Mr J. Byrne

The President had then to leave the Convention which was presided to the end by the Chairman Miss C. Flynn

Before the nominations for officers for Munster Council were considered the Hon. Secretary read a report submitted by the Co. Waterford representative to Munster Council in which she stated she was not satisfied with the administration of the finances of the Council

The Convention viewed this report with concern and gave the delegates to Munster Convention instructions to raise the relevant matters at that Convention and that their representatives on the Council should ensure monies were expended only as per rule

The following nominations were made:—(1) Chairman—Miss C. Flynn (Waterford) (2) Hon. Secretary—Miss S. Hogan (Cork) (3) Hon. Treasurer—Miss M. Montayne (Waterford)

The Convention next considered motions on the Agenda—(a) That County Finals be played not later than Sept 30th. This was dealt with by Bye-law No. 9

That the team consist of 15 players and the field be lengthened

This was opposed by Mr Comerford St. Mary's and Mr Byrne Lismore the former stressing the difficulty smaller clubs would have in getting 15 and the latter pointing out that more in a team would give larger counties an advantage

St. Columille's withdrew the motion

That referees be requested to study Rule Book

The Chairman pointed out that this was a recommendation rather than a motion and all agreed that referees should be thoroughly conversant with the rules

That the Selection Committee task end with the picking of the County team

That the County team be obliged to enter into strict training under the supervision of appointed trainers

That an amended form that the County team should have as many matches together before championships as finances would permit

That Congress be asked to remove ban on hockey

Referred to Congress From St. Mary's—(a) That the Selection Committee shall consist of 4 members 2 from Co. Champions and three nominated by Co. Board was amended by Bye-law 23—The Divisional Convention shall elect 2 members from the Eastern and Western Divisions and the Co.
