For SPRING SOWING 1. Because of unsuitable weather, winter wheat sowings have been small, it is all the more necessary, therefore, that the maximum amount of Spring wheat should be sown without delay... 2. Ample quantities of seed are available. Atle and Kolben are suitable for early Spring. Diamante, April Red, and Fylgia are recommended for later sowing. 3. Seed of 95% germination and upwards should be sown at the rate of 15 to 17 stones per statute acre according to the quality of the land. Where the germination is lower the rate of seeding should be proportionately increased. 4. If wheat must be sown after another cereal crop it should follow oats rather than wheat or barley.

Lismore and Cappouin Cow-Testing Association At the annual general meeting of the Lismore and Cappouin Cow-Testing Association held at the Courthouse Lismore on the 23rd Feb 1946 Mr A Ellis, Chairman presided.

The following herds show the greatest increase—Mr James Collender's increased by 2,000 lbs milk 82 70 lbs butter-fat. Mr M J McGrath's increased by 2,663 lbs milk and 110 69 lbs butter-fat.

The Lismore Estate Co once again had the highest yielding herd of 15 cows giving an average yield of 7,875 lbs milk 293 39 lbs butter-fat per cow.

DEATH OF MR PATRICK LACEY

We deeply regret to announce the death of Mr Patrick Lacey a well-known and most esteemed citizen of this town who passed away in Dublin with tragic suddenness on Tuesday evening week 19th ult.

He was second son of the late Seagrave Lacey, R.I. and an elder brother of Mr James Lacey the popular and efficient foreman of the Cappouin Bacon Factory. He had been in the Prison Service for over 40 years and had been Deputy Governor of Mountjoy Prison for several years past during which he had enjoyed the greatest respect and confidence of Mr Sean Kavanagh Governor and by the other leading officials of the prison.

He was noted for his great efficiency in the Clerical Department while in the responsible position of Deputy Governor his kindness and humane treatment of the prisoners under his charge were outstanding features of his character and this was proved by his memorial tributes paid to his memory by the prisoners in Mountjoy who had a special Requiem Mass offered up in the prison on Wednesday morning for the repose of his soul as a great kindness and consideration towards them on all occasions.
