Need For More Houses Stressed

Outlook Not Very Bright Yet

Mr T McCarthy, Chairman, presided at the usual meeting of the Dungarvan Urban District Council held on last Friday night. Messrs T A. Kyne, M. Morrissey, J. McGrath, L. Veale, Mr Clancy and N. Kelly were present. Messrs S. J. Moynihan, Manager J. Ormond, Acting Borough Surveyor and Mr. O'Meara, Acting Town Clerk, attended.

Mr Kyne—Yes, I did better class houses. Mr Clancy—We are having a technical discussion here and it is leading us nowhere. The question of the cost of houses at present is a big one, especially for poor people and I think that we should go slow.

Mr Clancy—Under different circumstances. Mr Clancy—We should be ready to start scheme as soon as the price of timber and other materials fall. It might be said that cinemas and garages are being built now but the amount of timber for these is nothing compared to what is needed.

Mr Clancy—No to the houses at Abbeyside. Mr Clancy—And is the Abbeyside scheme only at that stage now? Mr Clancy—How could it be any further advanced?

Mr Clancy—It is two years since the thing was started and it should be further on by this. Mr Clancy—The scheme for Abbeyside is a big one and includes 78 houses.

Mr Clancy—But we are going to knock down 60 so that it would be a flea bite out of the problem. Mr Clancy—You know more than anyone the need there is for houses.

Mr Clancy—There is a scheme of 78 houses for Abbeyside and the Manager has assured us that when sanction comes and I think we should ask the Department to expedite it, it will be possible to go ahead with the development of the site.

Mr Clancy—Yes that can be done. Mr Clancy—Could the Manager give us any idea of the cost of this scheme?

Mr Clancy—If I could not but in Clonilla they are going to build some five-roomed houses at £1,000 a piece.
