G. A. A.— CORK'S DOUBLE AT CLONMEL

Waterford Senior and
Minor Hurlers Suffer
Defeat

Cork scored a double victory over Waterford in the semi-finals of the Munster Senior and Minor Hurling Championships at Clonmel on Sunday last. At half-time in the senior game Cork led by 1 goal 6 points to 4 points for Waterford and in the minor match Cork led by 4 goals 1 point to 1 goal 1 point for Waterford.

The senior game was somewhat disappointing for while the Cork forwards showed speed they did not appear to get full value of their superiority in this department, though credit must be given to Waterford's defence particularly their half-back line in which Fleming, Keane and Good played a good hard game.

Both teams fielded out as selected but Waterford made one positional change bringing in Bastin from centre half back to mid field while John Keane returned to his old place at centre half back. This change certainly justified itself as both played an outstanding game.

The game was started by Veiv Rev Father Hilary C.P. a distinguished preacher well-known all over Ireland. He was accompanied by the Lord Mayor of Cork (Councillor Sheehan), the Mayor of Clonmel (Councillor R. Stapleton) and Veiv Rev Canon Hamilton Chauman Munster Council.

The attendance numbered 14,000 and the receipts were £1 16s.

THE SENIOR GAME
Waterford having won the toss played with a freshening breeze but were slow to get down and Joe Kelly opened the scoring for Cork in the sixth minute with a point. Waterford had no fewer than four overs before W. Galvin equaled in the eighth minute. Bastin took Waterford ahead with a grand point when he sent over a free from a very difficult angle in the tenth minute but M. O'Riordan equalised in the thirteenth minute. So far the match was very closely contested though both sets of forwards appeared to miss some very good openings.

In the eleventh minute Ring added a point from a free and G. O'Piard finished a clever movement with a goal for Cork in the twenty third minute of the play. Three minutes later the same player put Cork further ahead with a point. Ring tried to lob a free close in in the next minute but the ball was lashed out. He recovered very smartly and added a point for Waterford. Ring scored another point for Cork on a free and Bastin scored a grand point off a seven.

been made a couple of minutes previously in the Cork forward line Joe Kelly exchanging with O'Sullivan. The puckout reached Kelly and showing his great speed he added a grand goal in the 57th minute of the game. Waterford continued to strive hard to reduce the margin and their forwards went all out for scores. A free close in was taken by John Keane. He tried for a goal and got terrific power behind his drive but W. Murphy showed his usual brilliancy by diverting it from that at the expense of the seventy two.

Following two overs Ring clinched Cork's victory with a grand goal in the one fifth minute of the second half. By their victory Cork qualified to meet their old rivals Limerick in the Munster Final at Thurles on Sunday July 14th.

MINOR GAME
The minor game was a magnificent display of hurling and featured great credit to both teams. Waterford side was much lighter, but showed great speed and their first-time striking on the ground more than compensated for the handicap in weight as the Cork forwards and even some of the backs were inclined to 'pick' too much rather than play to a ground that was like a proverbial billiard table. However great credit must be given to the Cork defence and above all their goalkeeper (S. Blake) who gave a display that won the admiration of the large crowd present.

At half-time Cork led by 4-1 to 1-1 and though Waterford added by a freshening breeze did most of the attacking in the second half they failed to break down the Cork defence though at times the Waterford forwards appeared to be definitely unlucky not to score. It was certainly an impressive win for Cork and augurs well for future matches.

Playing with a fairly strong breeze Cork attacked from the throw-in. G. Murphy opened the scoring for Cork in the second minute. J. Thornhill (full-back) and C. Blake (goalkeeper) brought off some spectacular clearances before G. Power added a neat point for Cork in the 8th minute. Waterford followed in which both sides continued to thrill the crowd. P. Barry added a grand goal for Cork. J. O'Connor (a point) and Ned Feeney (a point) followed. Waterford in the next two minutes but when Waterford appeared to be making a match of it the Cork forwards got going and S. O'Mahony added a goal in the 20th minute. Waterford forced a 70 without scoring and then Cork rallied and had two '70's. The second of these was sent in by Power and Barry finished the large crowd with the net giving Cork a three-goal lead at half-time (4-1 to 1-1).

On resuming Waterford forced two sevens. Three subs came on for Waterford within the opening ten minutes and soon the Cork defence was well tested. COUNTY WATERFORD COMMITTEE OF AGRICULTURE SHEEP BREEDING SCHEME, 1946

For the purpose of improving the breeds of mountain sheep in County Waterford the Waterford Committee of Agriculture are prepared subject to the approval of the Department of Agriculture to locate a limited number of high-grade black-face rams on the commonage lands on the following conditions -

(1) The Committee shall grant to each selected applicant a premium of from £5 to £8 on the basis that the value of the premium shall be less by £3 than the cost of the ram subject to a maximum premium of £8

(2) In the allocation of rams preference will be given to applicants who apply on behalf of sheep owners who are prepared to mate the rams to selected ewes

(3) The Committee will endeavour to secure that only rams of a high standard of quality will be supplied but they cannot undertake responsibility in case any animal should subsequently prove unfruitful or unsatisfactory for breeding purposes

(4) Applicant shall be required to lodge with his application a deposit of £3 Of the amount so lodged one half may be retained by the Committee where a sufficient supply of rams being available a selected applicant fails to procure a ram

(5) In all cases of dispute in matters connected with this Scheme the decision of the Minister for Agriculture shall be final
