## WATERFORD COUNTY COUNCIL

### General Discussion On County Water Supplies

### Laxity Alleged In Scholarships Means Test

### Sympathy With An Taoiseach

Mr D Heskin TD Chairman presided at the Quarterly Meeting of the Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan on Monday last.

Despite the intensely inclement weather which prevailed there was a good attendance of members which included Messrs M. Harty M. J. Walsh M. McGrath Senator Butler G. Torpey T. Morrissey J. Quirk F. Roche W. Norris R. Barron J. Meade M. Morrissey TD W. Dower T. A. Kyne and J. Mansfield.

Messrs S. J. Moylanh County Manager and J. Dowling County Surveyor M. O'Flynn Secretary Board of Assistance D. S. Doyle Assistant County Surveyor T. Boyle County Accountant and J. Dowling County Secretary attended.

**Sympathy With An Taoiseach**

At the outset the Chairman referring to the recent death of An Taoiseach said that as An Taoiseach was the head of the State it was the duty of the Council without letting political views interfere to pass a vote of sympathy with him.

Mr. Morrissey seconded and the vote was passed in silence all standing.

**U.G.C. Scholarship Holders**

Mr. Harty (member of Government Body U.G.C.) reported that the County Council Scholarship holders at the University did extremely well during the past year and were a credit to the county.

**Turf Production**

Arising out of the passing of resolutions for overdrafts of £30,000 on the General Account and £20,000 on the Turf Production Account the Acting County Surveyor in reply to a question about the turf position said that the Council had 3478 tons in hand at the moment of which 1831 tons were in stores and 1800 tons in the bog. He valued the turf at £9,262 with outstanding accounts of £607 bringing the total to £9,869.

Replying to the Chairman Mr. Ormond said that they were losing on turf production.

**Chairman**—The Government should see that we do not bear any loss in turf production and any grants to offset these losses should not be lost sight of.

Mr. Walsh—They have made good the losses elsewhere and why not here?

**Chairman**—What is the loss here?

**Secretary**—At the end of last month the overdraft was £14,461 and with assets as stated the loss would be about £4,000.

**Chairman**—What was the loss last year?

**County Surveyor**—That's over the entire period since we started.

Mr. Quirk—That's not so bad so.

**Tramore Water Supply**

A resolution was passed authorising the excess expenditure of £400 on the above.

In reply to Senator Butler the Manager said that it would be a local charge on the rates.

**Water Badly Needed Everywhere**

The foregoing gave rise to a general discussion on the need for water supplies all over the county.

Mr. Quirk asked if there was any possibility of an extension of the Clonagh supply as there were six cottagers in the locality who badly need water.

The Chairman said that some years ago it was understood that the water would be extended from the Cooloun supply.

Mr. Flynn—From memory I think that is so.

Mr. Walsh—Cappoquin is also in need of a water supply at present the conditions are deplorable. The water is cut off from 6.30 p.m. to 7 a.m. and I have been told that the ratepayers there would not pay any water rates and I can't say that I blame them as the position is disgraceful. Business people and private consumers are grumbling about it as it is a serious matter.

**Manager**—If the water is scarce it must be cut off.

Mr. Walsh—There is a great waste at the intake as the pipes are too small.

**Chairman**—Isn't there a new

### scheme for Cappoquin and Lismore?

Mr. Walsh—That's a case of live horse and you'll get grass. That scheme will take three or four years.

**Chairman**—When will the scheme be ready?

Mr. Ormond—The matter is in the hands of the consulting engineer at present. I agree the present water supply at Cappoquin is inadequate the intake works are too small and to enlarge these at the moment would mean a waste of money as the new scheme is coming on.

Mr. Walsh—But what about the people in the meantime?

Mr. Ormond said that if everything went alright the scheme might be prepared within the next six or eight weeks.

Mr. Walsh said it was not good enough to have the water cut off at 6.30 in the evening until 7 o'clock the next morning.

**Manager**—That's done in a lot of towns.

Mr. Ormond said he would investigate the position of not cutting off the water until 9 p.m. each evening.

**Senator Butler** asked about the other schemes for the county with particular reference to Stradbally.

**Manager**—They are in the hands of the Engineer.

Mr. T. Morrissey—The people in Stradbally are suffering badly and have no water for six months of the year when the pump goes dry. There is the same complaint all over the county.

**Manager**—We will proceed with the schemes in order of priority.

Mr. Barron said he knew of four cottage-holders who had to travel a quarter of a mile for water and then it was a drain that it from.

**Manager**—It is the duty of local Medical Officers to report on the inadequacy of water supplies.

Mr. T. Morrissey said that the supply at Ballynare was good but two villages being supplied off the same line—Ballinacorney and Ballinard—had no drain of water and the people were under the impression that the pipe was being tapped somewhere.

Mr. Ormond—Mr. Dunne is making a complete investigation into the matter.

Mr. Harty mentioned the extension of the water supply from Ballinacorney to Helvick.

Referring to the lack of public lavatories at Clonagh Strand Mr. T. Morrissey said that there was great nuisance committed there. It was unfair to visitors not to have such a convenience and something should be done about it as it could easily cause an epidemic.

**Manager**—It was intended to erect one before the war but there were no pipes. As soon as there became available it will be done.

Mr. T. Morrissey—We are disgraced in Wexford and other places over it. Everyone is speaking about it.

Mr. Ormond—I agree with Mr. Morrissey. Clonagh is one of our leading seaside resorts and a public lavatory should be provided there as it is greatly needed.

Mr. Morrissey—Water and sewerage should all be made into one scheme and a grant got for the lot from the Transition Fund. I think that would be a better idea.

**Manager**—A comprehensive scheme has been prepared but it has not yet been submitted for sanction.

Mr. Morrissey—Ballinacorney people have to go a mile for water although the water from the Dungarvan supply is piped to within a quarter of a mile of them.

Dealing with the question the Manager said that the procedure to be followed was that the local Medical Officer reports on the supply and if one is needed the necessary work be prepared.

Mr. Kyne said that he had received a series of complaints about bad water supplies. He said that the people at Ballinacorney got their water from Ballynare while supplies at Scar and Carrighilla were also bad.

**Chairman**—All the Medical Officers should report on local supplies as they would satisfy themselves as to the needs.

Mr. Kyne—Is there an application for water in from Ballyville for two months?

**Manager**—I can't say I would have to look it up.

Mr. Kyne—I was told there is and that there was no reply. This is not usual for the Manager's office as I have always received replies from it myself.
