J F KENNY, Hon Secretary Growing Pleasure Craze Is Sign Of Weakness BISHOP OF WATERFORD CONDENSING DEGRADISING DRINK HABIT Out of the great love that he had for the youth of the Diocese he would at the first opportunity not to let down the Church and themselves by becoming slaves to the habit of intoxicating drink. Young men and young girls he said who became drunkards broke all the holy images that were in their minds and hearts and became like the Catholics that were just beginning to get a liking for intoxicating drinks that they would walk up some morning and find themselves incurable. The day came when they lost their freedom and their power of choice and when alcohol had got such a grip on them that they could not be sent for a box of matches but they had to go in and try and quench the terrible thirst which was in them. When they were asked to give a mess of their lives and breaking their wives hearts and then they heard of young men for whom so much had been done, becoming almost hopelessly addicted to drink before they were well started in life it should drive home to them the conviction that they were right when they made up their minds they would not take intoxicating drink. At the present time when there was so much indulgence so much artifice and so many young men and women should be convinced in the secret of their own minds and hearts that the right thing to do is to bear witness by their Association Badge that they were going to make the strictest of total abstinence. The reality was that the person who was a self-respecting and efficient was the person who did not indulge in intoxicating drinks. What sort of young people going to do if at 17 and 21 they became slaves to the demoralising and devastating habit of intoxicating drink. Rev A Doyle BA DB said that he had known people to drink simply from sheer fear of offending by refusing. He said that that was a misuse of hospitality a misuse of their greatest characteristic and a sad commentary on the generosity of their people. The craze for pleasure which was growing in their country was a sign of weakness and decline. What they wanted was an intensive public opinion which would set its face resolutely against the evils of drink.

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
