MILLING OF WHEAT FOR GROWERS ON COMMISSION

The Government has made an Order entitled the Emergency Powers (No 165) Order 1942 (Fourth Amendment) Order 1947 restricting the quantity of wheat which a grower may have milled on commission

The main provisions of the Order are as follows —

(1) the quantity of wheat which a grower of wheat may have milled on commission during any cereal year must not exceed one barrel of 280 lbs for each member (including any employee fed by him) of the grower's household at the commencement of the cereal year

(2) a grower of wheat who mills his own wheat may not have wheat milled on commission at any other

(3) a grower of wheat who does not mill his own wheat may not have wheat milled on commission at more than one mill

(4) a grower of wheat may not use any wheat grown by him or any product (other than offals) derived from milling such wheat except as food for himself and members of his household
