Memorable Day For Cappoquin

THRILLING MATCHES, SUCCESSFUL CONCERT, ENJOYABLE DANCE

SUNDAY last was yet another day in the Annals of memorable events which will be remembered for a long time by the people of Cappoquin. The programme arranged by a number of the town's residents with that genius of organisation Mr Michael J Sargent, P.C. at their head, proved highly successful and showed once again that Cappoquin can certainly do it when they put their minds to it.

The day's programme was jointly sponsored by the Cappoquin Hurling and Football Clubs who organised the hurling matches at the Sportsfield and the concert at the Desmond Cinema which was the responsibility of the final item on the programme which crowned the day's successes when they ran a very enjoyable dance at the Boathouse Hall that night.

The members of the Hurling Football and Rowing Clubs can certainly congratulate themselves on the huge success which attended the efforts and it is not out of place to mention especially Mr M J Sargent who first placed the idea before the clubs and later by his great organising and executive work done by Mr F X O'Leary N.T. who was master of ceremonies.

Long before the time came to start the spacious and comfortable Desmond Cinema was packed to capacity for the concert. Part I—The programme opened with a Savoy American Medley with Pete Cody's Orchestra and a song Empty Saddles by Pete Cody himself. A selection of modern airs was also rendered by the orchestra and at the conclusion the band was greeted with a great ovation. Mr Bill Rice of the Cork Melody Makers next appeared and gave an exquisite rendering of that very beautiful song "God Keep You Is My Prayer".

The hundreds of applause that followed was magnificent work done by Mr F X O'Leary N.T. who was master of ceremonies. These preliminaries certainly gave the fixture the atmosphere of an inter-county championship match and put the crowd in good mood.

Fox Scheme

Noxious Weeds Act, 1936
This Act is in force in every county and occupiers owners and other persons responsible for land are required to keep the land clear of the scheduled noxious weeds, viz thistle ragwort and dock. The Minister for Agriculture wishes to impose on all occupiers of land the serious loss caused by the spread of noxious weeds especially in circumstances when 'control' of such weeds is of vital importance. Any occupier whose lands are infested by noxious weeds will be liable to prosecution without previous notice.

Unexpected Death Of Popular Dungarvan Farmer

Late Mr. Thomas Phelan, Ballyneety

The tragic news of the unexpected death of Mr. Tom Phelan Ballyneety Dungarvan, which was made known on last Saturday evening May 31st, caused a great shock all over West Waterford where the Phelan family are well and popularly known. The late Mr. Phelan had been up and about during the previous week and had in fact attended the Mission at Kilgobnet on Thursday evening of last week. He got a bad turn in the early hours of Saturday morning and despite all possible care and attention he died on Saturday evening of the inoperable grip of his wife and family and other relatives.

The late Tom Phelan was a comparatively young man when he died and had always enjoyed robust health. A practical farmer of great ability and experience he was looked up to by the majority of the farming community of the neighbourhood and his advice always readily given to those who looked for it. He was eagerly accepted and acted upon with beneficial results.

He was a great follower of Gaelic games and seldom let an opportunity pass of seeing the matches played in the county and it was only on the previous Sunday, despite the torrential rain that he was present at the Dungarvan Gaelic field to witness the Waterford-Limerick inter-county junior matches.

He had a great national record although due to his unassuming and retiring nature many do not know that and in many younger days he had the fight for Irish Independence the late Tom Phelan was actively associated with the West Waterford Brigade IRA and his house was one of the first to be shelled in which the boys of the run found a welcome. This was not forgotten by his old comrades in the fight who draped the coffin bearing his remains on their shoulders on the last stage of the journey to Fourmilwater Church on last Sunday evening.

The funeral was attended by one of the largest and most representative corteges seen in the district for many years and the coffin was received and blessed by Rev. Fr. Walsh C.C. Fourmilwater.

On Monday morning while a heavy thunder storm rumbled over the Church and vivid lightning flashes lit up the darkened interior of the Office and Requiem Mass attended by a very large crowd of mourning relatives and friends was offered up for the eternal repose of his soul.

The celebrant of the Mass was Rev. Fr. L. Walsh C.C. Fourmilwater assisted by Rev. J. Hickey C.C. Grangemockler (deacon) and Rev. Fr. J. Morrissey C.C. Kilgobnet (sub-deacon).
