

After going through all the points in the evidence tendered the Justice imposed a suspensory sentence of 2 months imprisonment on the first count not to be enforced if defendant was of good behaviour for 12 months On each of the second and third counts the Justice fined defendant 10/- and allowed him I month for newmont him L month for payment
