Some knowledge of the art of glass-making existed in Ireland from an early period as small pieces of mosaic glass and cameo heads (as in the Tara Brooch, 9th century) are found in numerous works of Irish origin In the Tripartite Life of St Patrick' (7th or 8th century) mention is made of 'chalices of glass' Glass appears to have been made to a very small extent during the middle ages in Ireland, but it was not until the latter end of the 16th century that the manufacture of glass was seriously commenced About the middle of the 18th century began the great period of Irish glass-making and pieces were produced rivalling, and in many cases surpassing, the best wares of their kind in England and the Continent Many glass factories existed all over the country, Belfast (1781 to 1870) Cork (1782 to 1844), Waterford (1729 to 1852) Dublin (1630 to 1896), producing all manner of cut-glass articles. In 1746 an Act of English Parliament entirely prohibiting the export of glass from Ireland crippled a great and growing industry it eventually died out about 1896, Pugh of Dublin, whose unique "Lustre" cutting achieved such notable success, was the last
