SWIMMING

Famous Swimmers At Dungarvan Swimming Club Gala

RECORD CROWD WITNESS THRILLING RACES

TWO MUNSTER CHAMPIONSHIP TITLES FOR DUNGARVAN

ON Sunday last, the Dungarvan Swimming Club in holding its Fifth Annual Gala at the Pool, successfully staged such an ambitious programme as to put this annual event among the leading Galas in Ireland.

In bringing Miss Nancy Riach Scottish and British Ladies Champion over various distances from Glasgow and also her brother Mr Frazer Riach a noted diver as well as members of the famous Wellington Club of Belfast among whom was the famous E (Square) McCartney Irish Champion the Club displayed their initiative and their efforts were rewarded by the appreciation of the large crowd that attended.

The Gala commenced just after noon with a Life Saving Exhibition by the Irish Red Cross Water Safety Section. A feature of the morning session was the attendance by the Abbeyside Boy Scouts and their Band. During the exhibition which was given by J D Buggle R Feddis and J Murphy a commentary over the public address system was given by Mr P G Condon and a very big attendance watched with much interest the various methods which should be adopted in rescuing a drowning victim.

After a luncheon was over the various competitions commenced and the Club can feel very happy about the perfect seating accommodation which was provided for all. Most of the events were very closely contested, and one of the most thrilling races of the evening was the Ladies Junior Squad Munster Championship in which the Dungarvan team captained by Miss Millie McCarthy and with the Misses Janna and Rosemary CroTTY and Miss Mary Hill brought off a great victory.

The highlight of the evening was the exhibition by Miss Nancy Riach Nancy although a champion was a most unassuming young lady and for the short period of her visit she became popular with all the local swimmers who had the great pleasure of her acquaintance in her exhibition during which her brother Frazer gave a commentary she showed how easy swimming is when you know how to do it properly and with the control of an expert. She showed how the crawl should be done and the breaststroke and the butterfly and also some of the various training methods which she has practiced and which have brought her to the very top of her class in England and Scotland.

The diving display given by Frazer Riach drew rounds of spontaneous applause from the admiring spectators and this 18-year-old youth from Scotland who is presently acting as coach to the Dungarvan Club was the peak of perfection. A running commentary on the various dives by Mr Pat Culhane helped the spectators to appreciate the difficulties of the feats which otherwise appeared facile due to the great ability of the diver.

In the only confined race of the afternoon the Men's 50 Yards freestyle (scratch) Paddy Arrigan Abbeyside swam a great race to win from Tony Lawn and to hold for the first year a beautiful silver cup which has been presented to the Club for this event by a donor who we understand prefers to remain anonymous.

A feature of the Men's 220 Yards Freestyle was the great finish between G Hollywood Sunday's Well SC and E McCartney Wellington SC who were conceding a big handicap and who in winning equalled the Irish record over this distance.
