**YOUNG STUDENT**  
**LOSES LIFE IN**  
**TRAGIC ACCIDENT**

**Cliff Fall While Shooting**  
**Causes Fatal Injuries**

As night was falling at about 11 p.m. on Tuesday July 29th a young student named James Morrissey 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Declan Morrissey of Upper Helvic Road, Dungarvan, sustained injuries which later proved fatal when he fell down a sheer cliff to a ledge about 70 feet below at Helvic Head while going to retrieve some birds which he and another student had previously shot.

The tragedy caused great distress to the inhabitants of the locality where the deceased and his family are held in high esteem.

When word was received at Helvic Pier of the occurrence a rescue party set out in Mr. P. J. Morrissey's boat and having found the youth who was still conscious they managed at great personal risk to themselves to convey him back to the boat and thence to Helvic Pier.

After spiritual aid had been administered by Rev. Fr. Bracken, C.C. Ryan, a medical attention had been given by doctors Casey M.O. and Cusack young Morrissey was conveyed to the District Hospital in Dungarvan where he succumbed to the severe injuries which he had sustained on Wednesday morning.

The action of the rescue party, and especially of Mr. P. J. Morrissey solicitor and Mr. B. Mulcahy Dungarvan is deserving of the highest commendation.

**Evidence of Identification**

Declan Morrissey deposed I am father of deceased James Morrissey and I have seen and identified the remains. He was 19 years old a student at Rockwell College. I last saw him before the accident at about 3 p.m. old time on Tuesday evening and he was then in his usual good health.

**How The Tragedy Occurred**

The student who accompanied the deceased deposed I am presently on holiday at Helvic Head. I was with James Morrissey when he came to Helvic House where I am staying on Tuesday evening at about 8.45 p.m. and the two of us went around by Helvic Head and along by the cliffs where we were going to shoot foxes. We killed about 5 birds and were going down to get them where they had been perched on a cliff ledge close to us. He was going first and I was following him. He asked me what had happened and I told him he had missed his step and had fallen down. I asked him if I would go down for him but he said no I would only get a boat and I immediately went to get one. It was then about 10.45 p.m.

**Rescue Work**

Mr. P. J. Morrissey solicitor in his depositions stated that James Hogan came to me on Helvic Pier at about 10.40 p.m. saying that James Morrissey had fallen off a cliff and to get a boat out at once. At 10.45 p.m. Mr. Mulcahy Michael Tobin and myself left the pier and went over a mile to where we searched for James Morrissey. We had to put Mr. Hogan ashore so that he could point out the spot to us from the land. He pointed out the place by means of my Morse lamp. At this time four of us were up on the rocks searching and I found James Morrissey about 40 to 50 feet above sea level and from where he was at the top of the cliff was a sheer height of from 70 to 90 feet. He was lying on the flat of his back with his legs and arms stretched. I said an act of Contrition for him. He was conscious and asked me what happened. After a short time the others came to help. We got a rug from the boat and lifted him down the cliff into the boat. We tied his legs together as he complained of injury to his left leg. He also complained of injury to his back and as we carried him along he kept saying "don't let me down". We arrived back at Helvic at 12 midnight and we summoned medical and spiritual aid at once.

**Medical Evidence**

Dr. M. K. Cusack stated that he was called to the deceased at about 12.15 a.m. on Wednesday morning. I saw him at 12.30 a.m. (approximately) at Mr. P. J. Morrissey's house at Helvic Head. He was conscious and in a severely shocked and collapsed condition and a superficial examination revealed that he was extensively injured. Arrangements were made to have him removed by ambulance to the District Hospital at Dungarvan where I also attended him with the M.O.

On Wednesday afternoon, I performed a post mortem examination on the remains with Dr. O'Sullivan. The body was found to be a superficially young man. He had superficial abrasions on many parts of the body.

**Agriculture**

**Reduction Of Tillage**  
**Quota Urged**

**More Silos Should Be**  
**Erected**

Mr. P. R. Power, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the County Committee of Agriculture held in Dungarvan on Saturday last. Messrs R. Barron M. McGrath W. Norris M. Hart T. Morrissey and W. Dower were present.

Mr. D. Hurley Acting Secretary attended.

**Correspondence**  
Letters from the Department of Agriculture which were noted referred to the Poultry Stations Scheme for 1948 the 1947/48 National Egg Laying Tests. Approval of the purchase of spraying equipment and acknowledging the receipt of the resolution passed at the Committee's last meeting about the Tillage Order and Silos.

Arising from a further letter about stock feeding, Mr. O'Ryan asked if there were many silos in the county.

Mr. Hurley said that there were silos in Lismore and Kilmartin districts but outside of these there was not much being done to erect new ones.

Mr. O'Ryan suggested that a demonstration of how useful silos are should be given to farmers in order to popularize them.

Mr. Hart said that the grants for the erection of silos should be increased in order to give the poorer farmers a chance of erecting them.

**Secretary**—No grants for that purpose are given by this Committee but they are given under the Farm Improvements Scheme.

In reply to a question by Mr. Norris the Secretary said that the present cost of erecting a silo would be between £25 and £30 and the amount of the grant was £10.

Mr. O'Ryan—There are plenty farmers who could afford to erect silos and who have not done so and I think the best thing is to show people what an advantage they are in providing good feeding.

Mr. Morrissey—I think that there should be something to close them at the top as there is a lot of waste caused by leaving them open.

**Secretary**—They can easily be covered with scourings and things like that.

Mr. O'Ryan—You can't do it now but next spring we should ask the people to come and see some farm where there is ensilage.

Mr. Morrissey—These with full silos this year are alright as hay-making is a thing of the past.

After further discussion a resolution asking the Department to increase the grants under the Farm Improvements Scheme for the erection of silos to £20 in order to encourage them was proposed by Mr. Hart seconded by Mr. Norris, and passed unanimously.

**Premiums**  
It was decided to approve of the thirty applications for premium rams.

The Secretary stated that the amount allocated for these premiums was £250 but the Department would probably approve of an additional amount as they did in past years.

An application for a premium Boar from Thos. R. Claxton, Kilminton Stradally was approved.

The first meeting of the newly formed Committee was held at the Courthouse, Dungarvan on Tuesday night last. Mr. T. Tobin Chairman, presided. Also present were Messrs J. Duggan P. Morrissey P. McCarthy, M. Crotty Ed. Hickey M. Hehir, T. Mahoney McGarry and J. Morrissey Secretary.

It was decided to hold Committee meetings at 7 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month.

A long discussion took place on the possibility of building an alley and it was proposed by the Chairman seconded by Mr. Duggan that the UDC be approached on the matter as soon as possible with the hope of receiving some assistance. Methods of raising funds were also discussed but this matter was adjourned to the next meeting.

Other business of a minor nature was carried out and before concluding the Chairman expressed the hope that the Dungarvan Handball Club would go a long way on the road to success and advised all to stand together always.

In the future only club members will be allowed to play in the Barracks. Membership Cards must be produced and fees must be paid.

Anyone wishing to join the above club can obtain membership cards from anyone of the Committee members on the receipt of 6d entrance fee.

**Bread Rations For Harvest**  
**Labour**

After a long discussion on the difficulties of feeding helpers at threshings during which it was stated that the helpers expected the farmers to feed them and left their own rations at home, the following resolution, proposed by Mr. O'Ryan and seconded by Mr. McGrath, was passed unanimously.

That in view of the situation arising from bread rationing which confronts farmers in catering for the needs of their helpers at threshing time this coming harvest, each farmer being limited to his own family allowance, we request all Committees of Agriculture in Eire to co-operate with us in seeking an additional bread ration for threshings and it is our opinion that this would best be achieved by appointing a deputation representative of all Committees of Agriculture to meet the Minister for Agriculture and "press the case for increased bread rations, and we hereby appoint Mr. W. Norris to represent this Committee on the proposed deputation."

**Kerry Double**


**CORK SENIORS AND MINORS**  
**DEFEATED**

In the presence of a record crowd for Munster Championship—official gate receipts £2,559 11s, representing an attendance of 32,000 approximately—Kerry scored a great double in the final of the Munster Senior and Minor Football Championships when they beat Cork in both winning the senior match by 3-8 to 2-6 and the Minor Championship by 0-7 to 1-2.

**FIOOIREACT**  
**WEAVING**

The manufacture of woollen articles was one of the historic industries of Ireland. The detailed regulations of the Brehon Laws, 438 A.D. regarding the colours to be used by the different classes, and the description of ornamental textures in early literature show a considerable development of the craft. In later years an export trade developed both to England and the Continent. An Italian writer in the 14th century mentions a white serge which was much esteemed and called "Sain d'Irlande". After the 14th century the woollen trade attained such dimensions that it aroused the jealousy of English rivals with the result that legislation was enacted in 1698 ultimately causing its destruction.

Linen weaving, however, was allowed to expand. Flax culture and linen weaving had already been in existence in Ireland from earliest times, but it was not until the destruction of the woollen trade that linen weaving assumed importance in the country. In 1697 William III invited Louis Crommelin and other Huguenots from Holland to develop the industry in the North of Ireland, with the result that Irish Linen and Damasks are world renowned. Poplin owes its origin in Ireland also to Huguenots who settled in Dublin in 1693. Though most of the silk used is foreign, Dublin weavers succeed in making it a distinct fabric of unrivalled softness and brilliance of colouring.

SUGAR RATIONING NOTICE TO DOMESTIC CONSUMERS HEADS OF INSTITUTIONS, MANUFACTURERS, WHOLESALE AND RETAILERS The Minister for Industry and Commerce desires to announce that the distribution of brown sugar to the wholesale and retail trades will be discontinued with effect from 1st August 1947. Sufficient white sugar is now available to enable current rations to be met fully in that form when the stocks of brown sugar held by traders have been liquidated and arrangements are being made accordingly. It is not possible however to increase the domestic ration above 3 lb weekly or to increase the quantity of sugar which may be obtained on foot of permits held in any case. As from the ration week commencing on Saturday 2nd August 1947 therefore retail traders having only stocks of white sugar on hands should supply the full 3 lb weekly domestic ration to their registered customers in that form. Retail traders having stocks of brown sugar on hands may continue to supply a proportion not exceeding ONE-THIRD of the weekly domestic ration to their customers in the form of brown sugar until the stocks have been liquidated. The sugar coupon applicable to the ration week commencing on 2nd August 1947 is coupon No. 10, lettered "M" from page 34 of the General Ration Book (1944 issue). Heads of institutions, manufacturers, caterers and other persons holding sugar permits will not be required to accept any portion of their quotas in the form of brown sugar after 31st July 1947. Deliveries of white sugar to their suppliers are being adjusted to enable the full quotas to be met in the form of white sugar as from the month of August 1947, inclusive.
