n pre-Christian Ireland the art of building in wood and stone was well known. Few examples in wood remain, but many specimens in stone are still in existence, the dolmens and forts such as that of Dun Aonghusa. The early Christians adopted the pagan methods of building and erected beehive' cells as at Skellig-Michael and the Oratory of Gallarus. From these simple types developed the distinctive Irish Romanesque with its high pitched gables, inclined door and window jambs, shown at its full development in such perfect examples as Cormac's Chapel, Cashel, A D 1134, and the beautiful doorway of Clonfert Cathedral Round towers were also a remarkable feature of Irish architecture, having been built during the 9th to the 12th centuries. The change from Romanesque to Norman can be traced from the round to the pointed arch with again distinctive Irish features In contrast the Anglo-Norman style is seen in Christ Church Dublin Jerpoint Abbey A D 1155, shows the early development of Irish Gothic, whilst a good example of the late period is Holy Cross Abbey, A D 1169 The unsettled conditions in the country during Tudor, Elizabethan and Jacobean periods were not favourable to important building. The second half of the 18th century was the golden era of Ireland's Renaissance, and great public buildings and mansions were erected such as the Houses of Parliament, Trinity College, Leinster House and Charlemont House, etc. During this period the "Wide Streets Commissioners" started town planning on sound principles, and to them is due the notable thoroughfares in Dublin, such as O'Connell and

RATIONING OF BREAD, FLOUR & WHEATEN MEAL

NOTICE TO HOUSEHOLDERS In order to facilitate the exertion of the utmost effort in saving the grain harvest the Minister for Industry and Commerce has oecided to increase the basic domestic ration of bread flour and wheatmeal for the four weeks commencing on Saturday 30th, August and ending on Friday 26th September The maximum ration for that period will be 8 lbs of bread or 6 lbs of flour or wheaten-

meal a week per person The increased ration will not be granted to consumers resident in the County Borough of Dublin the Borough of Dun Laoghaire or the County Boroughs of Cork Limerick and Waterford The wheat supply position is extremely uncertain, and a severe strain will be placed on resources if the increase in the ration is availed of by a large proportion of the population. The Minister requests consumers not to ask for the increased ration unless they are actively engaged in connection with harvest operations and are in urgent personal need of extra bread or flour

Consumers who propose to avail themselves of the increase should notify their suppliers without delay but in any event not later than Saturday the 23rd August There will be no increase in rations of confectionery in supplementary allowances granted to heavy workers or the quantity of flour wheatenmeal or bread purchased under any special permit (e.g. Institutions
