

The ancient Irish were well acquainted with the use of oak bark for converting hides into leather and its artistic ornamentation was considered a relatively important craft in early Christian and mediaeval periods Owing to its perishable nature few examples have survived. Numerous articles were made, bottles for holding liquids, bags wallets corselets for soldiers in battle shields and shoes Ornamental specimens of the latter are to be seen in the National Museum. The finest examples of artistic leatherwork are the "Polaries," or book satchels, in which the precious books were carried or were hung upon the walls of the monastery 'libraries' Many references to them appear in our ancient writings indicating that they were in general use and formerly numerous, although only three specimens are now in existence. The satchel of the "Breac Moedoig" in the National Museum, Dublin, the satchel of an Irish missal at Corpus Christi College, Oxford, and the very beautiful satchel of the "Book of Armagh" in Trinity College Dublin

Ornamental leather book-covers, as distinct from the cumdachs or book-shrines in metal, were also made Good examples of such bindings are the "Life of St Columba" in the Franciscan Library, Dublin, and a copy of the "Gospel of St. John in Stonyhurst College, Lancashire During the period 1613 to 1800, book-binding in Ireland reached the highest peak of artistic perfection
