Irish craftsmen had already attained great skill in enamelling long before the coming of St. Patrick During the 5th to the 6th centuries, enamel of one colour only was in use, generally referred to as sealing wax "red This red colour, due to copper, is the despair of modern enamellers. A great raw lump of this red enamel was found near Tara In early times the delicate and intricate technique of milleflori enamel was well known, as numerous examples testify. How it was introduced into Ireland is not known, as the art was confined to only a few places in the Roman Empire, the most important being Namur, destroyed during the 3rd century AD. In the early Christian period the Irish craftsmen employed enamel with remarkable success Byzantium and Ireland were long the two centres of learning, and both were unrivalled for the beauty of their enamels Excellent examples of Irish work are to be seen on the Ardagh Chalice which shows three different processes of the craft, Champleve enamel, and two different kinds of Cloisonne In the National Museum there is a remarkable 10th century fragment containing enamels in red yellow, green and blue, and many other fine examples Irish craftsmen still continue to produce fine enamel work, due largely to the tuition received in the schools of art in Dublin, Cork and Belfast
