There can be no doubt about it that the most promising swimmer of the day was Paddy Arrigan the Abbeyside youth who won the 50 yards Backstroke Boys Diving and with E. Shine the Mens Relay. This was a real good hat-trick for young Arrigan who promises to fulfill the big expectations of him in future years. The ladies section of the club showed itself if anything to be stronger than the men with swimmers like the McCarthy sisters Miss Hill and Miss Crofty while there is also a great deal of budding talent in this section.

Waterford Co. Board G.A.A.

Mr W Kennelly, Chairman, presided at a meeting of the Waterford Co Board G.A.A. held at Mount St John Schools on Sunday evening last. The agenda was an interesting one and attracted a good attendance. Two appeals—one against the Waterford Board decision and an objection by Newtown to the Brickey Rangers—were heard and discussed. The chairman stated that the matter would be referred to the Board of Directors.

Eventually the Brickey Rangers delegate said they would reconsider the matter and he would let the Secretary know. Mr Curran said there was a possibility of their not being turned out owing to harvesting. The question of the referee then came up. Mr Astor had been appointed but the referee had not been heard of. It was suggested that in the event of his not turning out it would be advisable to appoint a second referee however, was allowed to stand. RESUMED INQUEST

The resumed inquest on Thomas Stapleton (68) County Council employee Chapel Street, Lismore who died at the District Hospital Dungarvan on August 25th having been involved in an accident on June 14th in which he sustained multiple injuries to his right knee and left elbow was held by Mr T C Williams Solicitor Deputy Coroner at the Courthouse, Dungarvan on Tuesday evening last sitting with Mr Justice.
