stained glass-work is the product of the union of two crafts, the glaziers and the enamellers, and imple evidence exists to show that from earliest times Irish craftsmen had a remarkable knowledge of both Traditions preserved in many places indicate that parchment and horn was used as a substitute for glass The stained glass which filled the windows of the various churches and abbeys throughout the country, is now known almost exclusively from records of its existence, all having been destroyed mainly for the lead used in their construction. The churches at Ennis. Galway, Downpatrick and Kilkenny are particularly mentioned as having fine stained glass windows. St. Canice's Cathedral, Kilkenny, had a famous window erected in 1353 and for which the Papal Nuncio, Mgr Rinuccini, during his stay in that city in 1648, offered £700 Two years later it was totally destroyed In the Kilkenny Museum there are fragments of 13th to 16th century glass that formerly adorned the Cathedral A few unearthed fragments are also all that remain of the magnificent east window of the Collegiate Church of St Mary's, Youghal During recent years Irish artists have produced outstanding examples of stained glass work that equal, and often surpass, the products of other countries This has been due mainly to the brilliant work by such notable artists as the late Michael Healy, Harry Clarke, and Sarah Purser
