RECORD CROWD WITNESS HARD, RUGGED GAME

Erin's Own (Co Champions) held their Senior Hurling Crown on Sunday last when after a hard, rugged and fast-striking game they proved worthy winners of the 1947 County Senior Hurling Championship.

The standard was not as high as that witnessed in the drawn game, but, nevertheless, it was a game well worth seeing. Erin's Own by their fieldcraft and good positional play foiled all attempts made by the Clonea men to turn defeat into victory in the closing minutes of the game.

The weather although threatening held up well all the day and from 11 a.m. onwards the town was astir. When the first train arrived from Waterford with a capacity crowd which included the Thomas Francis Meagher Band at about 12.30 p.m. lively scenes animated the precincts of the Square as the large crowds gathered there.

The Minor Co Hurling Championship game between Na Rainsigh and Cappoquin was started about 2 p.m. by referee P Ryan Chairman of the Western Board and as this game progressed the crowds were pouring into the minor.

As the minor match concluded the strains of the Dungarvan Brass and Reed Band were heard playing coming from the town to the field and shortly afterwards came the shriek of the pipes as the Abbotside Boy Scouts Band came into the picture.

At the conclusion of the minor game the four bands and the teams lined up and headed by the Dungarvan Band under Mr M Clancy the parade started from the far end of the field and headed by the Thomas Francis Meagher Band was next and the Abbotside Scouts Band and the Erin's Hope Fife and Drum Band with the banner took up positions behind the parade.

The stewarding up to this time was excellent especially on the side-line but both goal-lines were crowded and this led to some awkward scenes as the game progressed especially when matters became hot in the closing stages of the game but with the exception of a couple of stoppages to clear the crowds who lined around the goalposts all went well.

The game itself was played in a good sporting manner with hard knocks the order from start to finish and there was only one incident which looked back when tempers became frayed and a player from both sides were engaged in a fistfight but the referee quickly dealt with this matter by putting the two offenders to the sideline.
