Encouraging reports have been received that many farmers are availing themselves of the good weather to use home-grown seed wheat for the sowing of winter varieties and to prepare the land for sowings of imported seed, which, it is hoped, will arrive in the near future.

To avoid a heavy rush of spring work, ploughing should also be pushed ahead for the early sowing of spring crops.

The dressing of pastures with phosphatic manures at this time is of great advantage in producing good growth of grass in the early spring. Farmers ordering fertilisers now will be sure of getting their requirements and will help to relieve the pressure on transport in the busiest season.

Fresh Meat (Maximum Prices Order) 1947 The Minister for Industry and Commerce has made an Order fixing maximum retail prices for beet lamb and mutton. The Order comes into force on 8th November 1947

It has come to the Minister's notice that the prices charged by victualiers in a number of instances are too high in relation to the market pieces of cattle and sheep, and the Order has the effect of reducing prices to the appropriate level Meat prices cannot be controlled effectively without the co-operation of the public and the Minister earnestly appeals therefore to consumers not to pay more than the maximum prices for meat and to report without delay to the Prices Branch of the Dapartment (Grimth Bairacks South Circular Road Dublin) any attempted overcnarging Victuallers generally are required to display a list of the prices charged by them for the various cuts of meat

For the purposes of the Order the expression Dubin Zone shall mean the areas consisting of the County Borough of Dublin the administrative County of the word meat shall mean any description of beef mutton or lamb whether fresh or corned but shall not include Kosher

meat or any cooked meat or meat offals the expression kosher meat shall mean meat obtained from animais slaughtered in acordance with the Jewish practice of slaughter

the expression meat offals 'shall include suct bones liver neart tongue kidney brains sweetbread nies head feet tail skirt, melt, lights Belly reed and guts the expression siriom steak snall include filletted steak buckier steak, chump steak jump loin steak and porterhouse steak

the expression 'Fine Rib shall include hind rib and roast rib the expression Rib Steak shall include the clod the expression Cnuck Roast shall include a shoulder cut the expression " lop Rib shall include fore rib rough 11b and housekeepers cut


