Superannuation Allowances

Very Rev T Canon O'Brien P.P. VF Chairman presided at the monthly meeting of the above held at the Technical School on Monday evening last. Messrs M O'Hara, M O'Grath, M Walsh, M Butler, M Clancy, M Hartly, D Coghlan, L A Veale, T A Kyne, J Mansfield and Fr Curtis, O.S.A were present.

Superannuation Allowances

The Committee passed a resolution granting superannuation allowance of £535 19s 4d per annum being two thirds of the average of his salary for three years according to the Department's instructions to Mr J Lanigan C.E.O.

Mr Butler—I am not sure that the instructions of the Department and now that he is going out we must give him his superannuation. It appears that we are to pay that for nothing, but as I said it was not our desire that he go out. He has given good service and although we crossed swords with him on several occasions I must admit he has been a good official.

Chairman—I hope he will live long to enjoy it. The Acting C.E.O. thanked the members for their kind remarks.

In awarding a superannuation allowance of £225 19s 2d per annum to Mr L. L. O'Connell, Irish teacher at Cappoquin, the Inspector's health reasons were stated at the meeting. It was stated that in arriving at the figure consideration was given for six years service given by Mr O'Connell to the Gaelic League from 1911 to 1915. He had been 23 years as a whole-time teacher under the Waterford Committee and the allowance represented twenty-ninth-sixths of his salary.

Mr Butler—It would be as well to ask if the Kilkenny Committee would be liable for any portion of the amount.

Caretaker's Wages
Arising out of the consideration of the Department's letter concerning the wages of Mr P Lynch caretaker at Dungarvan school and about which the Committee recommended at the last meeting, the Inspector, concerned in the matter should attend this meeting. The Acting C.E.O. read a telegram from Mr Sheehy, Inspector, which he stated had been sent from Dublin at 3.5 p.m. that evening. The telegram was cannot attend Committee meeting today.

Mr Kyne—You haven't any further information to suppose about it than that the Inspector is afraid to attend here today.

Acting C.E.O.—No. Mr Walsh—I propose we adjourn it so until the next meeting.

Mr Kyne—You can send up my statement to him that I said he was afraid to attend.

Mr Lulligan—I am afraid that wouldn't be.

Mr Kyne—I suppose you are afraid too. Like all officials you're tied up to the Government but we're not officials and we don't give a damn about the Government.

Finally it was agreed to adjourn the matter until the next meeting and again request the Inspector to attend.

Mr Kyne said that he was dissenting as he reserved the right to take whatever action he chose in the meantime and said that the caretaker might be taken out from the school and if he is taken out, said Mr Kyne "be sure that you will get no other man here."

Procedure Criticised
Mr Veale said that he noticed a new kerbing around the garden and he ordered who gave authority for it as it had not come before the Committee. He asked if it were done on the instructions of the Inspector who had come down.

Acting C.E.O.—Yes, and there was authority in letters from the Department for the employment of a man in the garden.

Mr Kyne—Yes but only for garden work not for that. We object strongly to the ratepayers' money being spent on the instructions of officials like that.

Mr Walsh—I agree with Mr Kyne.

Waterford Board Of Public Assistance

Dentist Reprimanded Ballymacarby Dispensary District

Mr T. A. Kyne Chairman presided at the monthly meeting of the Waterford Board of Public Assistance on Monday last at Dungarvan.

Messrs J. Butler, P. Caulfield, M. O'Ryan, W. Kenneally, and M. McGrath were also present. Messrs S. J. Moynihan, Co. Manager, M. Flanagan, Supt. Assistant Officer, and M. Flynn, Secretary were in attendance.

Dentist Reprimanded For Laxity In Duty
Further to the request of the Chairman Mr Kyne at the last meeting the Secretary read a report from the Matron at the District Hospital, Dungarvan, concerning the attendance of the past six months. The report showed that the dentist had been absent on seven occasions and had been late in arriving on several other days.

In reply to a question the Secretary said that the dentist had not given reasons for non-attendance.

Chairman—What are his conditions has he to be there each week?

Secretary—Yes. Chairman—The report shows seven absences.

Mr Butler—On those days were there patients in attendance?

Secretary—I imagine so. Mr Butler—And probably from long distances.

Chairman—That is the complaint that I received in the first instance.

Secretary—What is the average attendance of patients on these occasions?

Secretary—About a dozen. Mr Butler—Has the dentist been asked for an explanation?

Secretary—No, but the Manager has dealt with him previously for laxity.

Manager—I warned him a few times in August last and on October 13th I had him before me specially and gave him a severe reprimand for laxity in his duty and I warned him that if there were any further serious complaints of this nature that I would have no hesitation in suspending him for a week.

Mr O'Ryan—There is no more we can do for the moment and we can only wait and see what effect that has.

Chairman—I am satisfied from what Mr O'Ryan has said that the matter is being attended to.

Mr Caulfield—I notice that the report says that it is often 2 1/2 hours in the day when he arrives. If he is supposed to be there at 12 o'clock he should be there then.

Chairman—Has he particular hours?

Secretary—He has. Mr O'Ryan—Well if he does not carry out his duties now the consequences will be on his own head.

Unfair Treatment
Mr Butler asked the proposed increase for the porter at the Co. Home.

Secretary—We have got to give the Department, even though we wrote about it last week. It is a great pity that that case has been left outstanding so long. All the other officials have got their increase and it is only the porter who should be overlooked. It is necessary for him to get up at 6.30 a.m. and he is on duty all day until 11 o'clock at night.

Mr O'Ryan—It is very unfair if the man doesn't get his increase. If he insisted we would have to have a strike there as there are two gates there and he can't be kept Boyle Roche's Bird.

Secretary—The Manager made an order granting the increase which is still pending.

Mr O'Ryan—How long ago? Manager—Oh it must be at least a couple of years.
