A regrettable feature in our tillage during the emergency was the absence of any material increase in the potato crop

The present improved fertilizer supplies should enable us to overcome the greatest obstacle to potato production

Potatoes are of great importance, both as human food and feeding for animals They provide a reserve store of food and are our second line of defence against want

The new production scheme will greatly increase the value of poultry on the farm Pig and cattle production also offers good returns For all these classes of stock, potatoes are a valuable and easily produced feeding stuff

There will also be an export market for any potatoes which are produced in excess of our requirements

Every farmer should, therefore, take steps to increase his production of potatoes this year.

The sprouting of an adequate supply of tubers should be put in hands at once for early planting The planting of whole sprouted certified seed as early as the season permits will contribute towards greater production, but to provide a substantially increased output a considerable extension in the area under potatoes is required
