THE ASHES

The Ashes trophy owes its origin to the Test match played between England and Australia at the Oval in August 1882. This game was played on a damaged cricket ground and was probably the most dramatic Test match in cricket history. Australia won by seven runs and after the match the sporting Times published an obituary notice in memory of English cricket which said that the 'ashes' taken to Australia 'it is said that the Ashes were the remains of the stumps used in this match and when England won the Rubber in 1884 the Ashes were presented in an Urn (illustrated above) by the Australian Team.

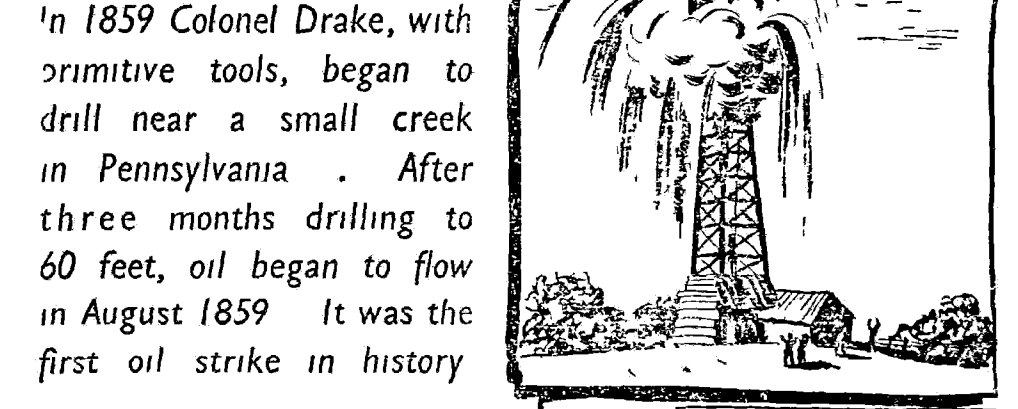
