Over £300 in prizes are being offered for the various competitions which include horses, cattle and sheep in various classes according to their different qualities—all of which will give the small farmer a good chance of winning a first as any of the bigger landowners. Death of Mr Jas Ahern, ex N.T., Youghal. Sincere regret will be occasioned by the death in Youghal after a brief illness of Mr Jas Ahern a well-known East Cork teacher. Born in Rathgabban, Ballymacarrig, 78 years ago he taught for a short period in Ovens prior to entering the De La Salle Training College, Waterford. Later he taught in Greenmount in the Model Schools and in the Mass and Paul's Parish Cork before his appointment as principal teacher in Leamlara NS in 1897. Here long years of zealous and successful teaching gained him the affection and esteem of children and parents. A life long and uncompromising Nationalist he was universally respected for his deep piety his unending strength of character and his exacting common sense. His retirement in 1932 he lived for a short time in Fermoy and came to Youghal in 1933 where he was a familiar figure at morning Mass and Church devotions. By his wife Peter his intellect remained vigorous and alert and up to his last illness he maintained his keen interest in current affairs. He survived by his wife who is now aged 85. He was a devoted father and a loving grandfather. He was buried in Leamlara and by three sons Rev J F Ahern CC Macroom Dr M Ahern Silvermings and Rev Dr J J Ahern St. Patrick's College, Maynooth and by one daughter Sr M Evangelist OP Sienna Convent Drogheda.

ECHOES FROM YOUGHAL

Death of Mr Jas Ahern, ex N.T., Youghal. Sincere regret will be occasioned by the death in Youghal after a brief illness of Mr Jas Ahern a well-known East Cork teacher. Born in Rathgabban, Ballymacarrig, 78 years ago he taught for a short period in Ovens prior to entering the De La Salle Training College, Waterford. Later he taught in Greenmount in the Model Schools and in the Mass and Paul's Parish Cork before his appointment as principal teacher in Leamlara NS in 1897. Here long years of zealous and successful teaching gained him the affection and esteem of children and parents. A life long and uncompromising Nationalist he was universally respected for his deep piety his unending strength of character and his exacting common sense. His retirement in 1932 he lived for a short time in Fermoy and came to Youghal in 1933 where he was a familiar figure at morning Mass and Church devotions.
