Waterford Board Of Public Assistance

Election Of Chairman And Vice-Chairman

Discussion On Auditor's Report

Mr T Kyn T D presided at the Annual Meeting of the County Board of Public Assistance held in Dungarvan on Monday last. Also present were Messrs M O Ryan, Mr McCaffrey, Mr O Connor, Mr Broome, P O Connor, J Butler and P Caulfield. Mr M O Flynn, Secretary attended.

Chairman and Vice-Chairman
Senator Butler said that it gave him very great pleasure to propose the re-election of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman Mr Caulfield for the coming year. He said that they had worked well together on the Board and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman had given every satisfaction and everyone was pleased they had conducted the business of the Board.

Mr O Connor seconded Mr Kyn's proposal and said that Mr Caulfield should be re-elected as Chairman and Mr Ryan as Vice-Chairman. He said that Mr Ryan had been a distinguished member of the Board for many years. He held that it was good thing for the chairmanship to change around and he felt it would do him no harm to go back to the rank and file.

Mr Kyn said that with the permission of the Board and seconded Mr Ryan withdrew and proposed Mr Caulfield for the chair.

Senator Butler said that he had no objection and commended Mr Kyn for the proposal. He adopted in proposing that Mr Kyn's nomination if he had allowed his name to go forward would have been elected as Chairman.

Mr Caulfield was accordingly unanimously elected to the chair and thanked the members for their tribute and said that he would have supported Mr Kyn's nomination if he had allowed his name to go forward. Mr Kyn was then unanimously elected Vice-Chairman and continued to preside according to rule at this meeting.

House Phones to Cost £338

The Secretary informed the members that a quotation of £338 had been received for the installation of house phones at the County Hospital Waterford. Mr Kyn said that he thought these phones were not really needed and pointed out that the cost was high.

The Secretary said that the system would be very convenient for the purpose of communications.

It was finally decided to refer the matter to the Manager.

Auditor's Report

The report of Mr M O Condon, Auditor on the accounts of the Board for the year ended 31st March 1947 was not considered.

Part of the report stated—The issue of cards to the recipients of Home Assistance is recommended and a record of every payment received is made in the card by the Assisting Officer at the time of payment. The Superintendent Assisting Officer by occasional visits to recipients and on inspection of their cards and by the position to verify the regular disbursement of assistance. The Home Assistance cards should be collected when the period to which they are applicable expires and be available for checking at audit. The Supt Assisting Officer and the Assisting Officers appear to have performed their respective duties with efficiency and with punctuality.

The checking of institutional account-books has not been done competently by the Board's staff. The various checks sent themselves with the arithmetic of the records but do not advert to the facts underlying the records. An example of this is to be found in the checking according to scale of the issues of provisions which the result that the total issues shown in the account exceed the quantities available for issue. A re-organisation of the duties of the Storekeepers at the County Hospital and at the County Home is desirable. It is necessary that the Stocktakers do not have access to the figures shown in the books. The Day-books do not show a record of the goods in the receipt and are consequently unreliable.

Mr Butler asked about the auditor's reference to the checking of the books of the Institutions.

The Secretary said that the only thing that the checkers had to go on was the dietary scale and in some cases the whole of the diet would not be given out and it would look as if there was more issued than was on hand. He said that it was the amount consumed that was taken into account.

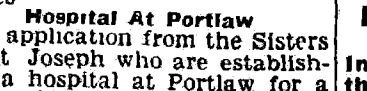

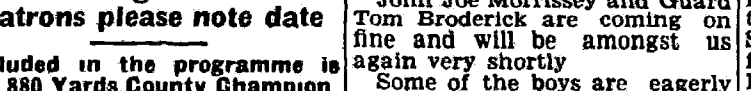

DEATH OF PROF F KENNEDY TRAMORE

The death took place unexpectedly on Saturday last of Professor Frank Kennedy Tramore aged 49 years. Deceased qualified as a Secondary Teacher in University College, Cork in which occasion he took his diploma in Celtic Studies. His first appointment as a Secondary Teacher was at Castletown College after which he joined the staff of Mount St. Charles Waterford. Some years later he was appointed at Mount Melleray Seminary during which time he lived in Cappoquin. He subsequently returned to Mount St. Charles and remained there up to the time of his death.

Some ten years ago the late Professor Kennedy was elected President of the Secondary Teachers Association of Ireland and was a Peace Commissioner for Waterford and Tramore and was also a life trustee of the Tramore Golf Club of which he was Hon Secretary from 1931 to 1937. He was President of the Tramore Branch of Gluain Na Buaidhe and Chairman of Tramore G.A.A. Club. A native of Thurles, his wife, Mrs. Kennedy, died in 1931. He was survived by all those who had the pleasure of knowing him. To his bereaved widow and children we wish to tender our deepest sympathy in their great sorrow.
