DUNGARVAN DISTRICT COURT

Decree In Trespass Case

Publican Fined

The Dungarvan District Court was held on Tuesday last by Mr J. M. C. O'Connell. Michael Fives Burgery Dunbarvan claimed £8 damages caused to his fences and land by the trespass of two horses, the property of James Wright Fitzgibbon, Turric Dunbarvan. Mr J. J. Kenny Solicitor for plaintiff and Mr P. J. Moriarty Solicitor for defendant.

In his evidence plaintiff said that he was told that defendant's horses were on his land on June 18th but when he went there between 5 a.m. and 6 a.m. the horses were gone but he saw tracks in the field and he immediately reported the matter to the police. On June 19th he went back at 10 p.m. and the two horses were there and with the help of some friends he managed to catch them. The defendant came to him on the following day and offered to settle the case but plaintiff was told of all the trespass. He said that he had a trouble with the horses and he would not pass for a long time and he found it almost impossible to keep the fence of his fields in proper order. When defendant came to him he offered to repair the broken fences.

In reply to the Justice witness said that the defendant was 10 p.m. for two workmen and on his way home he spent some time in the fields for grass on the 14th June and on the 15th June he saw the defendant's horses in the fields. In reply to Mr Moriarty witness admitted that he only caught defendant's horses on one occasion.

James Wright in evidence said that he was a carrier and owned a number of horses. On June 19th he sent them out with his brother to put them into the quarry at Knockmore. He said that he was not in Mr Fives' field on any other occasion. When he offered to settle with Mr Fives for the damage caused plaintiff would not accept it. He said that this horse was not responsible for the breaking down of the fences and said that Mr Fives workmen told him that the children in the locality were not allowed to go into the fields. The Justice granted a decree for £3.

Local Publican Fined
Supt. P. O'Mahony summoned James Wright publican at Grattan for breach of the Licensing Laws on May 14th. A number of men and on the premises were also summoned. Mr J. P. Kenny Solicitor for defendant and Mr P. J. Moriarty Solicitor for plaintiff. The defendant was fined £2 on May 14th on his 14th Guard Ballyculla at the front door of the licensed premises and said Guards on duty when the breach was committed. He said that he had been told by his brother that he had been fined £2 on May 14th. The Justice imposed a fine of £3 not to be recorded and each of the men summoned £5.

CO WATERFORD COMMITTEE OF AGRICULTURE SHEEP BREEDING SCHEME, 1948

For the purpose of improving the breeds of Mountain Sheep in County Waterford the Waterford Committee of Agriculture are prepared to locate a limited number of high grade black-face rams on the commonage areas of the Comeragh Mountains on the following conditions

(1) The Committee shall grant to each selected applicant a premium of from £5 to £8 on the basis that the value of the premium shall be less by £2 than the cost price of the ram subject to a maximum premium of £8

(2) In the allocation of rams preference will be given to applicants who apply in behalf of sheep owners who are prepared to mate the rams to selected ewes

(3) The Committee will endeavour to secure that only rams of high standard of quality will be supplied but they cannot undertake responsibility in case any animal should subsequently prove unfruitful or unsatisfactory for breeding purposes

(4) Each applicant shall be required to lodge with his application a deposit of £10 of which the amount so lodged one half may be retained by the Committee where a sufficient supply of rams being available a selected applicant fails to procure a ram

(5) In all cases of dispute in matters connected with this Scheme the decision of the Minister for Agriculture shall be final

CO WATERFORD SHEEP DIPPING REGULATIONS, 1948

The Council of the County of Waterford being the Local Authority under the Diseases of Animals (Ireland) Acts, 1894 to 1945 for the administrative County of Waterford acting through and under the authority of the County Manager do hereby for the purposes specified in article 22 of the Sheep Dipping Order, 1937, and in pursuance of the said Order make the following regulations which shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1947

All sheep in the Administrative Area of County Waterford which falls to comply with any of the Regulations shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1948

These Regulations shall apply to the entire area of the County of Waterford and shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1947
