Tony a debonair pleasant-speaking Doncaster has rocked his huge audience in the Capitol Theatre Dublin and at Buisson's Holiday Camp Mosney Co Meath with his delightful tunes and medleys of songs and on Saturday night last his voice was heard in the Cork Minors on Sunday

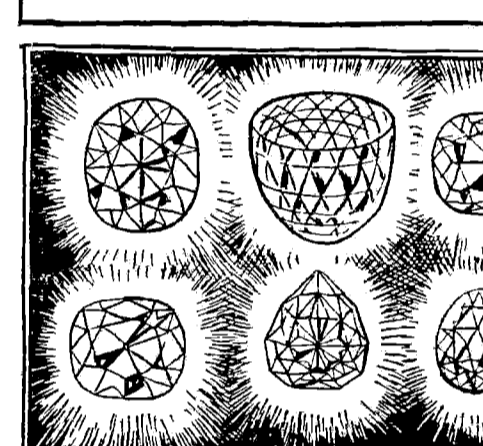


FORTUNE CALLS FROM A GAME OF MARBLES

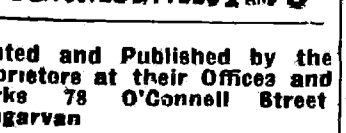
