## RATIONING OF BREAD, FLOUR AND WHEATENMEAL

## NOTICE TO HOUSEHOLDERS

(1) In order to facilitate the work of saving the grain harvest the Minister for Industry and Commerce has decided to increase the basic domestic ration of bread flour and wheatenmeal for the four weeks commencing on Saturday, 28th August and ending on Friday, 24th September The maximum ration for that period will be 8 lbs of bread or 6 lbs, of flour or 7 lbs of wheatenmeal a week per person
