Obituary—A deep feeling of gloom was cast over the whole town and surrounding district when it became known early on Sunday that Mr. Frank Wiloughby of Chapel Street, Lismore had passed to his eternal reward.

Of mature years the deceased suffered a very brief illness and his unexpected demise came as an unpleasant shock to his wide circle of friends and acquaintances. A stern and upright member of the community he was a diligent parent, a fond husband and a tried and trusted friend.

Financial Scheme for 1949/50
The financial scheme for 1949/50 presented by the Acting C.E.O. and considered by the Committee.

The estimated amount required to meet the expenses of the Committee was given at £11,893. The main items of this amount were (1) Administrative Salaries of C.E.O. and Clerk £1,089 (2) Teachers' salaries (30) £7,722 (3) Maintenance of schools and classes £2,423 (4) Scholarships and prizes £576

Mr Mansfield questioned the costs of the school garden and pointed out that while the receipts from sale of produce amounted to only £5, the cost of seeds and fertilisers was £7 and of additional labour £52, making a total of £59.

It was stated that the garden was mainly for educational purposes.
