Youth Who Slashed Tyres Sent To Jail

Jail Sentence For Motor Cyclist

Abusive Language Cases

The Dungarvan District Court held before Mr. Eamonn O'Riain D.J. on Tuesday last was the longest held for a long time, and when the court rose at approximately 6 p.m. the list had not been completed as a number of cases had been adjourned.

Lights on Vehicles
The usual fine was imposed on a number of defendants, who were summoned for cycling at night without lights.

A number of School Attendance cases were also dealt with and also a number of drunkness charges.

Unlicensed Wireless Holders Fined
The Minister for Posts and Telegraphs had a number of locals summoned under the Wireless Telegraphy Act for holding wireless receiving sets without licences.

Dr. Counihan State Solicitor who prosecuted stated that the usual number of 2,000 licences were renewed this year but the Minister felt that many people had wireless for which no licences were in force and a campaign was started.

As a result of a vigorous campaign 35,000 licences were taken out during the first fortnight in October and the campaign which would cost £5,000 in the year was proceeding.

Dr. Counihan stated that he had been requested to make the observations and to ask for the court's co-operation in the matter.

The defendants were Catherine Drummey, 38 Loughmore Gate, Kloban, 12 Wolf Tonne Road, Mathew Oran, 3 Sarsfield's St., Bridget Dolan, 5 Mitchell St. and Bridget Dwyer, 42 Mitchell St.

Evidence on behalf of the prosecution was given by Mr. Colm Daly, Post Office Official, Waterford.

A fine of 5/- with 8 expenses was imposed in each case.

Information Refused
In the case of the Attorney General v. Richard S. Knight with an address in Dublin who was charged with obtaining goods to the value of £400 and with issuing a worthless cheque the Justice on the request of the State Solicitor refused information in the charge when the latter stated that the charge was a "thin" one and that the defendant would be charged with obtaining credit contrary to the Debtors Act.

Case Withdrawn
The case of Mrs. Cummins, Connolly Road, Dungarvan, who claimed £25 against Miss Mary Murray, Co. Home, was withdrawn by consent.

Licenses
The renewal of the certificate of license for the Dungarvan Literary Club was granted. Mr. T. C. Williams, Solicitor, made the application.

Four applications on behalf of Mr. P. J. Power for occasional licenses were granted.

An application by Mr. M. J. Keane for an occasional license for a dance at the Town Hall on St. Stephen's Night was granted. A license for a celloid at Ring by the I.C.A. on next Sunday night was granted to Miss Marjorie O'Modhraim.

Youth Who Slashed Tyres Sent To Jail

tyres was leaking and as far as he could see it had been cut clean through by a sharp instrument as the tube was also cut. He stated that as a result of the cut the tyre which he valued at about £20 was useless and could not be used again.

In reply to the Justice witness said that the cut was on the wall of the tyre and appeared to have been freshly made.

Mr. M. O'Donovan brother of the previous witness said that he also owned a lorry and was also hauling beet for C.I.E. on Nov. 12th. After finishing work that day he left his lorry outside his lodgings in Mitchell Street. At about 7.45 p.m. he went out and heard one of the tyres of his brother's lorry leaking and went in and told him. They examined the tyre and came to the conclusion that it had been cut as it was a very clean mark.

On the following morning he examined his own lorry as he usually did before starting work and found one of his own tyres cut but not right through. The tyre was however damaged beyond repair and was worth about £16.

In reply to Mr. Kenny witness said that prior to coming to Dungarvan he never heard of Egan.

The next witness for the prosecution was Inspector Hayes who stated that he investigated the case and interviewed the defendant at the barracks and took a statement from him after caution.

Mr. Kenny said that he objected to the statement being taken into evidence.

Supt.—Who was present when this statement was taken?

Inspector—In the day room I presume.

Mr. Kenny—Did you give any advice to this young man with the purpose of inducing him to make a statement?

Inspector—Certainly not.

Mr. Kenny—Did you tell him that if he didn't admit it he would be charged with assault?

Inspector—No.

Mr. Kenny—What is your impression of this young man's intelligence would you say it is below normal?

Inspector—It was my first time seeing him and I thought that he was not of average intelligence.

In reply to the Justice the Inspector said that he was perfectly satisfied that defendant had sufficient intelligence to appreciate what he was doing.

The next witness was Guard J. O'Dea who stated that he was present during the course of the statement being taken. He heard it read out to defendant and saw him sign it. He heard no threat made to defendant to sign it and defendant appeared to know what he was doing.

Mr. Kenny—There was no question of a threat being made?

Guard O'Dea—It was dictated.

Mr. Kenny—There was no question and answer?

Guard O'Dea—It was being freely dictated.

In reply to further questions witness said that defendant may not be up to average intelligence. Witness was not at the barracks when defendant was brought in Justice (to Mr. Kenny)—Do you wish to call evidence about the indictment?

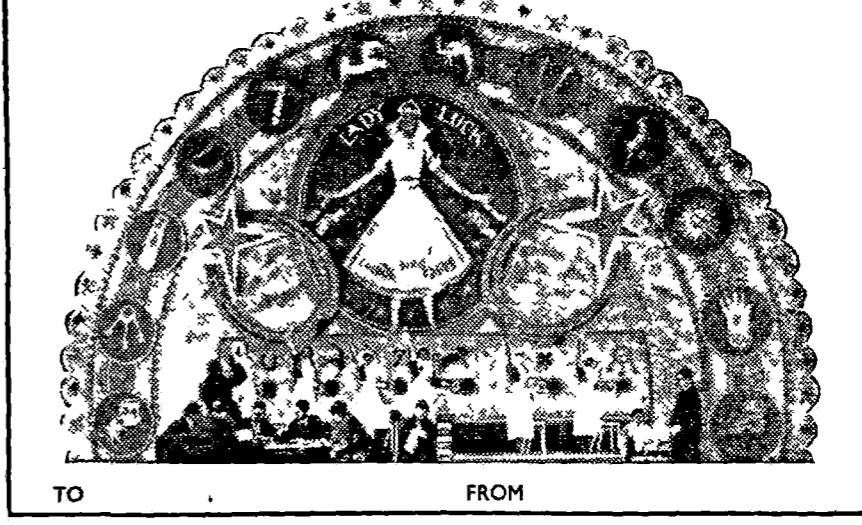
