And now we turn the Spotlight on a tragic story which took place in our harbour during the Christmas of 1895. It was on December 23rd when the 750-ton vessel Moresby appeared off Ballinacourty Head. Her sails were all in rags and she seemed in great distress.

The storm which had been blowing all day had by midnight developed into a hurricane and flames were seen shooting from the stricken vessel calling for assistance. On the morning of the 24th of December word came to Dungarvan that a crew was plighted on the vessel.

The lift boat succeeded in saving seven members of the crew before the vessel went down but two of these died after being brought ashore. The bodies were laid to rest in the Protestant Churchyard and later on relatives of those who visited the graves and expressed their thanks to all those who rendered assistance.

Following the tragic occurrence an inquiry was held concerning the action of the Ballinacourty lifeboat which was censured by the inquiry for its action on the night in question.

FISHING RIGHTS ON BLACKWATER

(To The Editor)

In answer to a recent question in the Daily Minister for Lands stated that he did not think it would be in the public interests to vest the fishing rights of the river Blackwater in the tenants of the land adjoining the river.

Only a small number of farmers is concerned as the majority of them have got the fishing and sporting rights though all alike pay rent and rates for that half of the river adjoining their lands.

How did this state of affairs come about? Under the 1903 Land Act the farms were vested in the tenant by agreement between the landlord and tenant.

I am neither a farmer nor a riparian owner but I have studied this question on the spot and realise that the farmers concerned have a genuine grievance and all grievances are to be settled by agreement.

In 1921 we accepted the Free State though still reserving our rights to try for full freedom. We have now obtained a Republic and thus a few farmers still deprived of their rights remain quiescent.

I would suggest however that if and where the sporting and fishery rights are vested in the tenants these rights should not be disposed of apart from the land and should not be leased for my period exceeding five years.
