Sanitary Services Act

Consideration of the following notice of motion proposed by Mr Torpey and seconded by Mr P Barron was the first item on the agenda. We propose that in accordance with Section 50 of the Local Government (Sanitary Services) Act 1948 the expenses incurred by the Council as the Rural Sanitary Authority be charged on the whole of the County Health District and that no application under the Act to charge such expenses on a particular part of the County Health District be made in respect of the coming financial year.

Mr O'Ryan pointed out that there was no motion in relation to the first resolution of the Council which had decided to have the public charges made separate charges.

Rather than seeing the mail bag appear started figuring things out. The boat's position at the time of the supposed find told them that it could not be the genuine mail bag. They decided that when the opportunity arose they would drag the mail bag and get the mail. Days, weeks and months passed by and then one morning over two years later the two fishermen carried out their plans and succeeded in recovering the lost mail bag. They took it to the home of one of them and there allowed it to dry out. Finally it was opened and its contents carefully examined. They were all letters to the distance above the hole and the importance of the mail was absolutely worthless. The two men were disappointed but ever afterwards treated the matter as a confidential joke.

Workmen's Compensation Case

Claims For Malicious Injury

Sympathy Expressed On Death Of Judge Sealy

The Hilary Sitting of Dungarvan and Lismore Circuit Courts commenced before his Lordship Judge Roe at the Courthouse, Dungarvan, on Tuesday last.

Prior to the business of the Court his Lordship referring to the death of Judge Sealy said that he had all sustained a great loss. He said that he had had the privilege of practising before the Sealy for many years and that he had known him to appreciate his qualities. He went on to say that all who knew him held Judge Sealy in great esteem and affection as he was a very great man and a very good Judge and now they all mourned the loss of a good friend.

He had presided in the Courts for over twenty years and his Lordship proposed that the Co-Registrar be asked on behalf of the Bar, the Solicitors and the Garda Authorities, to convey to the widow and family of the late Judge Sealy their very deep sympathy on their loss.

Mr O'Arcy B.L. on behalf of the Bar associated himself with the expression of sympathy said that Judge Sealy had presided in the Courts of this Circuit for a long time and he had done so with the greatest ability and integrity. He had qualified when Judge Sealy had started as Judge. This being so Mr O'Arcy said that they had all done up with an appreciation of the high standard of Justice in this Circuit and he was regarded by everyone in that light. The late Judge had possessed the highest character that had ever adorned a bench and had done many acts of kindness without ostentation which many had not appreciated for many years after.

On behalf of the Bar then he said that they were all extremely sorry that Judge Sealy did not live longer. He was a man of great worth and he was sure that he had gone to a better reward which he so richly deserved.

Mr C Williams Solicitor said that during the whole of his professional life Judge Sealy was the only Judge he had practised before in the Circuits before his Lordship had been appointed. He had looked upon him as a Judge of the highest calibre and he knew the Irish people well and had possessed everything that any man who sat on a bench might like to have.

Superintendent P O'Mahony, on behalf of the Garda Authorities, associating himself with the expression of sympathy said that they all felt the loss of a great friend by the death of Judge Sealy.

Mr Colbert Co Registrar also begged to be associated with the expressions of sympathy.

Review Of Workmen's Compensation Cases
On the conclusion of the respondents the case of Michael Bluet Shandon Street Dungarvan v Waterford County Council under the Workmen's Compensation Act was reviewed.

Mr O'Arcy B.L. (Mr Hally Williams solr) was for the Co Council and Mr Clarke B.L. (Mr Williams solr) was for Mr Bluet. Mr O'Arcy stated that the original order for compensation was made by Judge Sealy on an accident sustained by Bluet on April 5th 1940. At that time the applicant had been employed by his clients road-making and he had been struck by a heavy iron pipe and his right eye was damaged. The vision of that eye was gone now but his case was that this man was one-eyed but after nine years should have become accustomed to his condition and he should be fit for certain work.

Since the order had been made Bluet had been paid 35/- a week on the finding of total incapacity. Mr Cusack in evidence, stated that he had examined Bluet on December 15th last. He was 24 years of age and was generally healthy. His right eye was blind to all intents and purposes but the vision of his left eye was normal.

The doctor said that he saw no reason why Bluet should not be able to do any kind of labouring work. At the time of the examination applicant had complained that his nerves were shivering, that he had pain in his left eye in his forehead and the crown of his head and that he was not able to work due to the loss of sight. In reply to Mr Clarke, witness said that applicant did not show any signs of nervousness or complaint of insomnia when he was being examined. He agreed if the applicant's complaints were so that they would be symptoms of neurasthenia.
