Fianna Fail Ceannair Meeting

Mr. Ormonde's Speech

At the Annual Meeting of the Dungarvan Fianna Fail Ceannair the following speech was delivered by Mr Sean Ormonde TD

It is now practically twelve months since the Parties comprising the Coalition banded themselves together to oust from office the greatest leader of our time the man who guided the destinies of this country through the most difficult years of its history and having ousted Fianna Fail that they might share in the spoils of office as is evident from the composition of this Coalition Cabinet

All the Parties of this Coalition blamed Fianna Fail when in office for the adverse conditions which affected our people during the emergency and post-war years They blamed them for the rationing of certain commodities for the check to our industrial advance for unemployment and for emigration notwithstanding that they knew that the Government were entirely due to circumstances outside the control of the Government They are sufficiently long in power now to remedy those things and what have they done Has rationing been done away with or is it not If anything it has been tightened up Rationing is being continued by the Coalition not for the same reason which influenced Fianna Fail in introducing it Fianna Fail's reason was to give a just and equitable share of the available goods to every individual they wished to ensure that the rich would not take all and the poor would have their share

The position in regard to our industries has improved rather than improved Nothing is being done to afford them the protection which is essential to increased production and which industrialists are entitled to if they are to be encouraged to put their money into the Government and expansion of our industries Unemployment as everyone is aware, is considerably greater than it was when the Coalition took over for every act of economy and retrenchment they have made has added to the unemployment ranks And what of emigration that drain on our population for which each and every one of the Coalition Parties blamed and soundly rated Fianna Fail What have they done since coming into power to stem this tide? All they have done is to introduce a plan of emigration and eyewitness the setting up of a Commission of Enquiry into its causes and how best it may be counteracted Surely the individual of least intelligence knows the cause a lack of industry to absorb the surplus and also knows the remedy a building up of our industries to provide employment Fianna Fail knows the remedy but were unable during the war years to apply it owing to a lack of raw materials and equipment which brought our industries practically to a standstill But in 1947 when things were beginning to look better and the back to normal emigration was on the decline and the unemployed figures were steadily decreasing Today however while the Government are blinding the people with a Commission of Enquiry into its causes and how best it may be counteracted it is steadily going on apace

War was not as imminent as it appeared twelve months ago and one penny is to be spent in protecting the lives of the people While every country in the world today big and small is in a panic building up their good their defences our army has been considerably reduced and not a finger is being raised to put our country in a state of defence

Under Mr Dillon, largely because it suits England we are to raise cattle and export them on the hoof and import increasing quantities of cereals Where is this going to lead us in time of war? The fact that we came through the last war without the dreadful calamity of famine and of seeing our people die of starvation was entirely due to the tillage policy of Fianna Fail We must at all costs have our own requirements of wheat

The same is true of another essential-fuel The Government are not encouraging the production of turf but in addition they are dipping into our stocks of coal We are being made dependent on current imports of coal We know that during the war our imports of coal were nil If a new war should find us with no reserves of coal and our turf industry undeveloped we surely will be in a bad plight

Before I conclude let me refer briefly to the Republic of Ireland which has been in the hands of the Coalition since the prize money will amount to in or about £50 with half and other prizes thrown in The drives run by the Young Men's Society have since their inception been the most popular as patrons have always had a good value for their money and in addition feel that they are supporting a Society worthy of support
