An Appreciative Onlooker... Dear Sir—Today brings my mind back to 1921 and particularly when I read your account of the Burgery ambush. I also read the letter from the Elliott sisters re the ambush. Well, sir, I can assure you that the Leader is read with interest in this far-away town of Christchurch. I know a few Waterford people about here and how we were in the ambush at your place. I am a bit disappointed with your account as you have left a lot out about the early stages of the Ambush. It is right that our intrepid referees should blow up Tarr's Bridge but in the meantime we heard they had gone out raiding so as Gus Plunkett was with us that night we decided "as you know Plunkett very much liked a bit of action to meet them on their way home. We thought they would go home via Ballycoe road instead of the Burgery road and we had our best men and arms stationed at the old horse cross as your meeting place they were attacked mostly with shot guns a few rifles a Peter the Painter and a couple of I.M.B. bombs. By the time the main party arrived at the scene the Tans were well on their way down in the meantime Pat Keating and a few more were following in the car which Thomas Hicks and I think Sheppard was in. Then Johnny was burned and we retired up to Kilgobnet. While we were waiting for Pat Keating R.I.P. to arrive as his prisoners were dismissed before going home we were told to go home by the Burgery Road and if we found or saw anything to come home and report. How we got home was a mystery without being seen is a mystery anyhow when I was arrested later Thomas accused me for being in the ambush. I must have been seen by a girl that kept company with the Tans. The priest at Abbeyside were very good to us and very reliable. Mrs O'Grain R.I.P. cut a lot of sandwiches for us and I remember sharing them with Pat Keating R.I.P. O'Grain and Ned Vesale came home with me that morning. The most stupid thing that could have been done was to come back to the scene of the ambush as we lost two of our best men in a few seconds if we were fighting in the British Army we would be heroes, but when we are fighting for our own country we are criminals—it's a queer world. I am sure you can find all the information you require as when I was home 18 months ago I had many a yarn with some of the men that were in the ambush that night. 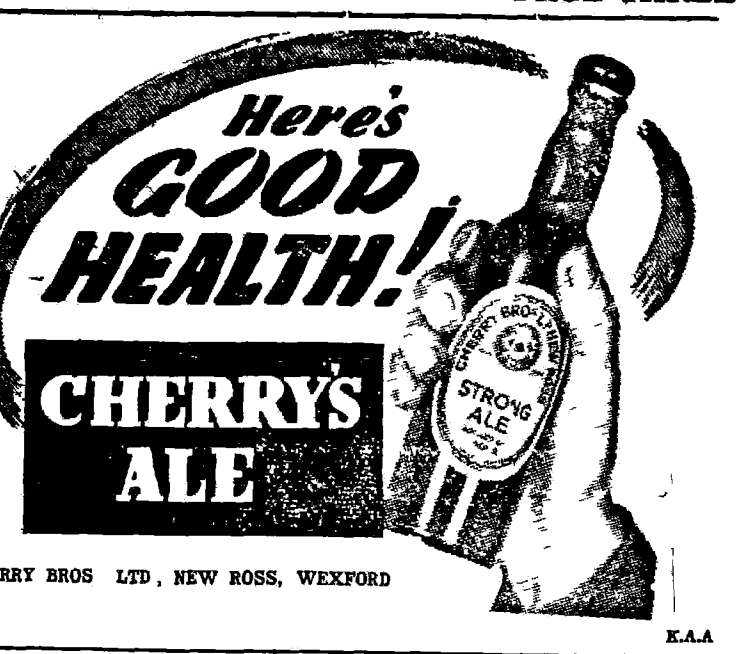

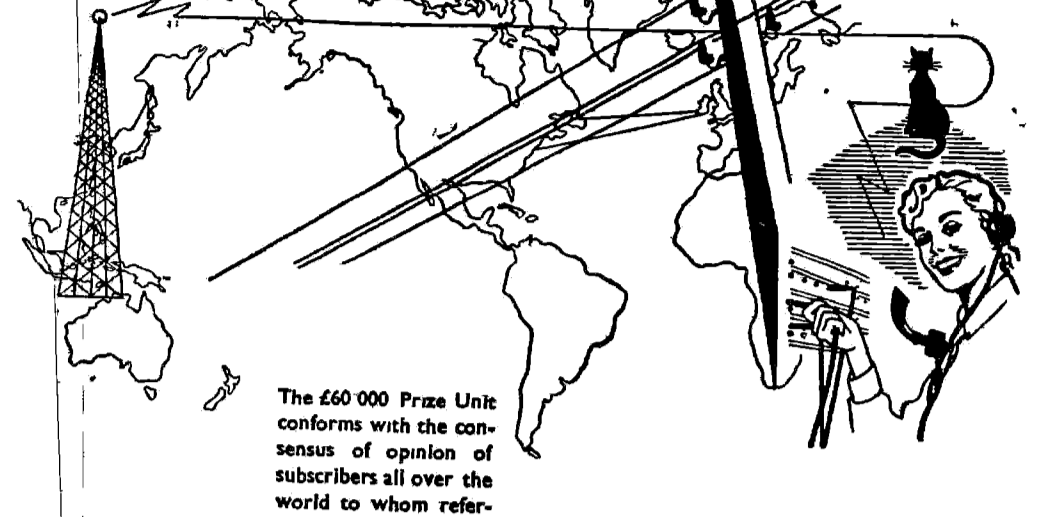
