APPOINTMENT OF MEDICAL OFFICER OF PORTLAW DISPENSARY DISTRICT

The Waterford Board of Public Assistance invite applications for the above position from Medical Practitioners who are legally qualified for appointment under Section 5 (1) of the Local Authorities (Officers and Employees) Act, 1926

The salary attached to the office is £350 per annum increasing by annual increments of £15 to £500 per annum with the usual Registration and vaccination fees together with £56 a year as Medical Officer of Health. The latter salary is fixed on condition that the person appointed carries out in addition to the duties prescribed in Article 15 of the Local Government Board Sanitary Order No 1 of the 3rd May 1900 and in Article 4 of the Vaccination Regulations 1942 the following duties without extra remuneration—

(a) Immunisation duties (other than vaccination against smallpox)

(b) Sanitary treatment of cases of tuberculosis assigned to him by the County Medical Officer of Health

(c) Duties which may be necessary in connection with the making of housing surveys under the Labourers Acts and Orders

(d) Treatment of minor ailments in children referred to him under an approved School Medical Service Scheme by the County Medical Officer of Health

In calculating the salary to be paid to the person appointed due allowance will be made for his previous period of service

Applicants must state in their applications whether they have made arrangements to reside in a central part of the District if appointed

Each applicant must clearly state in his application the nature of the duties of his present office (or in the case of a pensioned officer of the office previously held by him), his length of service and the date of his birth. A pensioned officer must also state the amount of his allowance and the name of the Local Authority from whom he receives it

dispute especially if they were going to a fair at Dungarvan meant short-cut of three miles Sometimes they used the footpath except when they would have a cart He said that he remembered a gate at the gate when he was a young boy and also remembered his father who used the gap going to the village with a horse and cart

Referring to the cowpath witness said that there was plenty of room to take a "butt" through it and it had been used in such a way as long as he could remember

In reply to Mr Gleeson witness said that they had always had the right of way but he had passed over it every day of the week about 20 years ago when he had been doing contract work for the Co Council

Mr A Spears B.E. giving evidence of maps he had drawn stated that the cowpath was wide enough to allow carts to go through

William Cunningham (40) another of the witnesses said that he had worked with Alier Merrin from 1936 to 1947 and before that he had worked for the Co Council He had always used the passage over Curran's land and his father before him had used it and had never been any trouble until Mr Curran came

Mr Cunningham (42) said that from 1922 to 1928 he went over the passage every day when he had been working drawing stones for the Co Council His family had always used it

Patrick Roche farm labourer said that he used to work with Cunningham and had brought his cart through the disputed gap and up the cowpath

Laurence Barron (76) retired rural postman said that in his time he saw signs of common bog in the area through the Cunningham's land and had ridden a pony through it about 20 years ago

Mrs Pearce Dublin said that she used to go to Miss Stella Merrin in her young days and she remembered seeing the Cunningham's and others using the passage and bringing horses and carts through and there never had been a dispute

Thomas Fitzgerald farmer Glenkleigh said that he had used the passage over 20 years ago

This concluded the evidence and his Lordship giving judgment stated that he proposed to make a declaratory order to clarify the position It was a shocking burden to put on any man's land to drive horses and carts over a fence over the right of way on foot over the land and he was satisfied from the evidence that the horses and carts were driven over the land but because it was a right of way but only when the defendants had been working for Miss Merrin and they had no claim to go over it with horses and carts and the nature of the evidence was sufficient to prove that there was a right of way and what he proposed doing was to make an order declaring that the defendants were entitled to a right of way on foot over the stile and over a defined raised path to a bog and they were not entitled to a right of way for cattle horses and carts as they claimed

Dealing with the question of costs his Lordship directed that they be taxed and paid by the plaintiff

Decree In Malicious Injury Case

A decree for £29 14s 6d. against Waterford Co Council was granted to Mr Michael Geary of Knockrook Talow for the malicious burning of a rick of straw his property on Feb 16th

Mr Hally solr for the Co Council admitted the claim and his Lordship fixed the electoral area of Talow as the area of charge

Nicholson v Smith

In the case of Julia Nicholson (17) domestic servant Headboro Talow claiming under the Wages Act compensation for loss of wages against Mrs Smith Headboro Horse Talow Mr D'Arcy B.L. (instructed by Messrs Keane Solicitors) stated that his client and her parents had agreed to accept the offer of £2160 plus compensation at 2s 6p per week from 29th January last when payment was stopped up to the present and an offer to pay for a further operation to remove the stump of the finger where applicant like in Waterford or Cork

His Lordship filing an agreement in these terms directed that £150 be invested by the Co Registrar to the satisfaction of the applicant and the arrears of compensation be paid out to applicant's father for her keep and £10 to Mr Keane solicitor to have a bicycle purchased for her

Applicant's technical School Director directed that the offer of a further operation be kept open for 3 years

Applicant claimed on foot of an accident she sustained on 13/1/48 when a child of enameled went under her nail rendering her hand septic and necessitating amputation from the second joint of the middle finger of the right hand

Patrick Whelan Ballinahlia Bonmahon v Mitchellstown Co-Op Creameries claiming £243 damages for the alleged breach of warranty and breach of contract in the sale of pigs by defendants' plaintiffs was granted a decree for £130 with costs

TEN MINUTES FOR FITNESS All set to go? Then first of all to shake off the lassitude created by the nice warm bed have a good stretch Stand with the feet slightly apart and raise on your feet to the head and swing your arms over head and s-t-r-e-t-c-h...

Exercise No 1 Stand erect feet slightly apart arms outstretched in line with the shoulders Arms move fairly quickly in a backward motion in ever-increasing arcs, reaching the widest possible arc on the sixth count Breathe naturally Perform eight complete sets...

Exercise No 2 Raise the right arm forward to shoulder level Swing the right leg up endeavouring to kick the hand See that the trunk remains erect and perform the kick ten times with each leg...

Exercise No 3 Commence with the feet fairly wide apart and the arms overhead in a straight line Now bend forward from the waist and swing the arms down between the legs touching the floor as far back as possible When bringing the arms back make sure that you reach as high as you can Perform this movement twelve times...


