





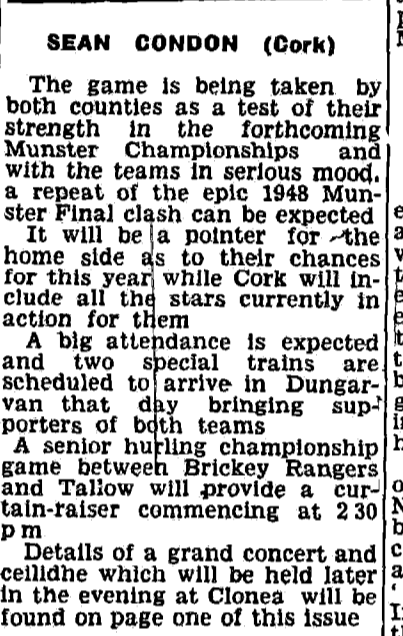

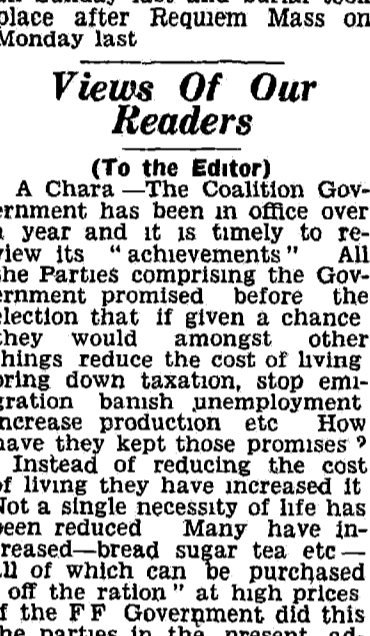

An account of his exploits has been written and is called "The Triumphs of Callaghan of Cashel". In this work the fight he carried on against the Scandinavians is described with vigour and the valour and strength of the people of the Deise who aided him is acknowledged... In regard to an attack he made on Meath he deserves no credit. He made an arrangement with the Scandinavians at Waterford to assist himself in the Munster army in forcing their way into that district in the year 939. The combined forces plundered two large monasteries took the two abbot prisoners and did a considerable amount of damage in addition... Donogh the High King at the time was not able to contend with the Scandinavians and he both prisoners and did a considerable amount of damage in addition... During his absence Callaghan gathered together an army in that portion of Munster that remained under his control and he went to war with Na Deise Ceileachar King of Na Deise, lost his life in the struggle as well as a considerable portion of his people but the army succeeded in holding together. Help arrived from Ossory and the combined armies of Na Deise and Ossory defeated the Munster army before the commencement of the winter.

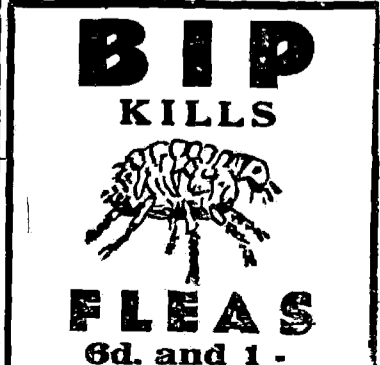
