CONFIRMATION AT DUNGARVAN

Bishop Exhorts Children Not To Take Religion For Granted

St Mary's Parish Church was crowded to the doors on Sunday last when His Lordship Most Rev. Dr. Cahalan, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, made his usual visitation to administer the sacrament of Confirmation. Occupying the seats of honour, in front of the high altar were over two hundred boys and girls from the various schools in the parish for whom the day was such a great occasion.

The ceremonies commenced with Mass at 11.30 a.m. to which the Dungarvan Brass and Band paraded through the sun-drenched streets on the first really summer's day. Inside the church the appreciation of the great event could be seen in the faces of the children—the girls in radiant white with flowing veils on one side and the boys neatly attired in their new suits on the other.

After Mass his Lordship ascended the pulpit and spoke to the children in general. His opening remarks were all of a congratulatory nature. He congratulated Very Rev. Canon O'Brien and the Priests of the Parish on the fine reports on the Faith of the Parishioners and congratulated all for the very beautiful church they now had.

Then referring to the recent collection for Maynooth College his Lordship said that the Dungarvan had easily proved the 1st parish in the whole diocese with a sum totalling over £154. For this great response he again thanked Canon O'Brien for the ardent manner in which he managed the collection. He also thanked the Committee and the Catholic fathers and mothers and business people who had all helped to make the collection such a great success.

His Lordship went on to deal with the excellent reports he had received of the Parish and said that Dungarvan was the centre of the Faith of our Fathers in the district and he said that he would like if the people made the most of the Mission which was due to start in the Parish within a fortnight. Thanking the teachers of the schools in the Parish—the Christian Brothers, the Mercy Convent and Presentation Convent and the National Schools of Carriglea and Glenbeg his Lordship made special reference to the two latter stating that he had been the product of a National School himself. He said that there was a great battle going on in the world of today for the mind of the child and he reminded the teachers of the great responsibility they had of seeing that the child was built up developed and instructed in the doctrine of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity made man. He said that it was a great act of confidence and trust on parents to hand over their children to the teachers who should leave nothing undone to see that these children were properly instructed.

He said that he was conscious of their great indebtedness to the teachers for the wonderful work they were doing and it was a great boon that there was so much harmony between the home the school and the church.

Roche, P.P., and as he walked through the centre aisle of the church he blessed the huge congregation who were present to witness the sacred ceremony which was celebrated at 10.30 a.m. by Rev. M. Power, C.C., his Lordship with Very Rev. T. Canon O'Brien, P.P., V.F. Dungarvan, and Rev. J. Roche, P.P., Abbeyside were present in the sanctuary.

Remuneration Of Officers

Reporting on the sanction of the Minister for Local Government on the above, the County Manager stated that increases in some cases were left out of the last circular of approval. The new sanction meant an increase of 7 1/2 per cent for all against 11/- in the last circular and it was now proposed to give an increase of 7 1/2 per cent to all officers or 11/- whichever was the greater.

Overdraft

Approval was given for the raising of an overdraft of £5,000 for the reconstruction of 33 houses at Portlaurd pending receipt of the loan of £14,850.

Special Grant

A letter from the Local Government Department notified a grant of £36,000 under the Special County Road Scheme as per the schemes submitted by the County Surveyor. The Chairman raised the point as to whether it was correct to give sweeping powers to local Authorities to enter lands to repair embankments even though damage would be done to the lands of the occupier. He said the interests of the people should be protected.

It was agreed at the outset of the quarterly meeting of the Waterford Co. Council held in Dungarvan on Monday last (Mr. D. Heslin chairman presiding), that only the urgent items on the agenda be dealt with and that the meeting stand adjourned as a mark of respect to the late Mr. J. Murphy Minister for Local Government.

Strong Protest Against Ireland Bill

Proposing the following resolution: "That we pledge ourselves in union with the Irish Race the world over to accept the challenge of the British Government to declare the perpetual Partition of our country and declare that we will use every means in our power to undo the demon of partition of our country. We call on our Race the world over to come to our assistance and to unmask the British Government who are condemning Russia and have condemned Germany for doing the self same thing for which they are now responsible in Ireland."

Sympathy

Notes of sympathy were passed with Mr. P. R. Power Chairman County Committee of Agriculture on the death of his mother and with Mr. P. Durand, Rate Collector Waterford on the death of his wife.

Late Minister For Local Government

Senator Butler said that he felt that the Waterford County Council and every other Local Authority in the country had suffered a great loss on the death of the Minister for Local Government and he proposed that a resolution of sympathy be passed with the bereaved widow and family of the late Mr. Murphy. He said that Mr. Murphy and himself had been intimate friends for more than 30 years and in that time he had not met a more sincere man since 1923 he was a member of the Executive of the Labour Party and while he was a great interest and while he was a great and sensible advocate for their cause he never forgot the interests of others.

Michael Nagle, Cathal Brugha Place and Patrick O'Connor, Fitzgerald Terrace, Dungarvan were each fined 10/- and ordered to pay costs. 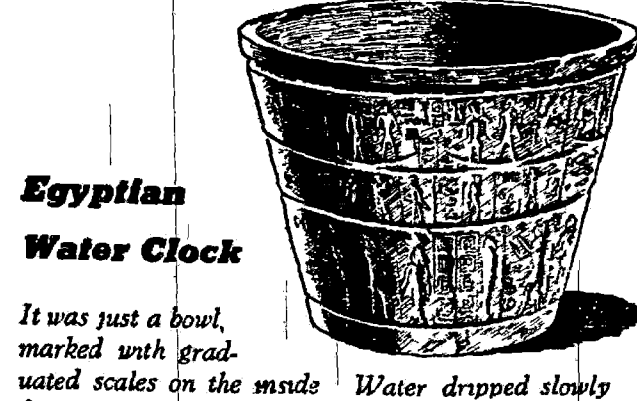

SPOTLIGHT ON THE UNKNOWN

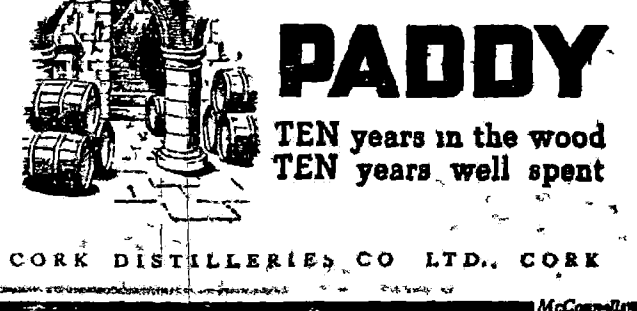
