

TEA AND SUGAR RATIONING

Preliminary Notice to Householders, Heads of Institutions and Shopkeepers

The Minister for Industry and Commerce announces as foliows (a) NEW TEA REGISTRATION PAGE It has been

decided to alter the arrangements for the provision of tea supplies to traders. As from a date in the near future which will be announced shortly the supplies of tea to traders will be regulated by coupons taken from the ten registration pages of their customers. In order that this change may be made it is necessary that all householders should deposit Pages 6 (marked Tae, Tea) from the Ration Books of members of their household with the shopkeeper from whom they wish to obtain their rations of tea Householders are warned that unless they do this not later than the 11th June they will run the risk of being unable to obtain their rations without interruption when the new arrangements take effect

Heads of institutions such as schools colleges convents hospitals nursing homes sanatoria etc are likewise warned that the fresh registration pages for tea in respect of all resident personnel should be loaged with their retail suppliers not later than the 11th June All existing tea quotas and permits for institutions will be abolished on the All existing tea introduction of the new arrangements






