TEA SUPPLIES

The Minister for Industry and Commerce announces that as from the 1st August 1949 the weekly ration of tea may be supplemented by purchases outside the ration without limit as to quantity at a retail price of 5/6 a lb for tea other than China tea China tea is available, but may only be bought outside the ration at a retail price of 6/6 a lb

The present tea ration of 2 ozs a week will continue to be available at the retail price of 2/8 a lb As from the 1st August 1949 all permits to purchase tea


