

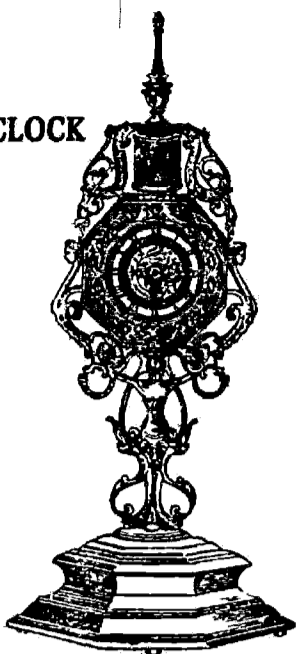






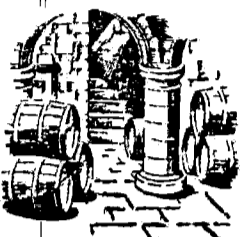
PEDESTAL TABLE CLOCK c 16th CENTURY

Miss Montayne is daughter of Mr and Mrs Monayne, Stranacally Knockmore and is well known in Camogie circles.



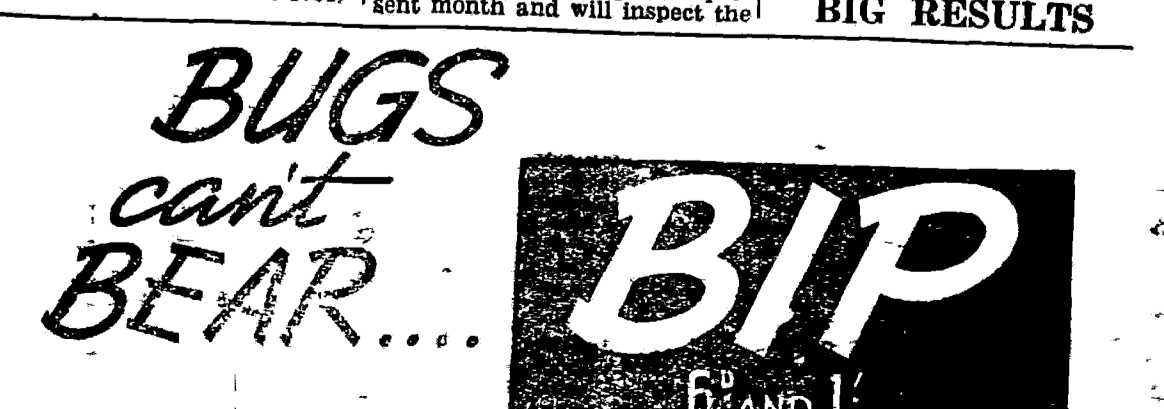

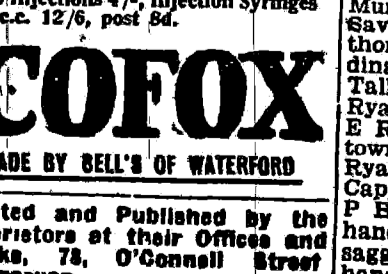
