Exercise 2 For Ladies—Quick Leg Swinging This is a very good exercise if performed properly for giving a good shape to the thighs and the lower portion of the back. It also makes the joints slender and gives the hips gracefulness. Here is the method for performing the exercise—Support yourself by placing one hand on a high object—a bed-post or chair etc. If you start with the right hand swing the left leg forwards and backwards in quick short swings. You must perform about 20 swings backwards and forwards with each leg in turn. The first 16 swings should be short and quick and there should be no pause between each swing. The last four should be made as long as possible, that is you kick as high as you can and bring the leg as far back as you can. This is to make the hip joints more supple. Remember the first 16 are short swings, the last four long swings. For the last four the arm that is loose should swing in an opposite direction to the leg. Breathe deeply and quietly when you are advanced you can perform the exercise without the aid of a chair etc. and it acts as a good balance exercise. When you come to this stage however as the right leg is swinging forward the right arm should swing back and the left arm should swing forward. Immediately after completing the desired amount of repetitions with both sides perform the deep breathing exercise as given in previous Notes.
