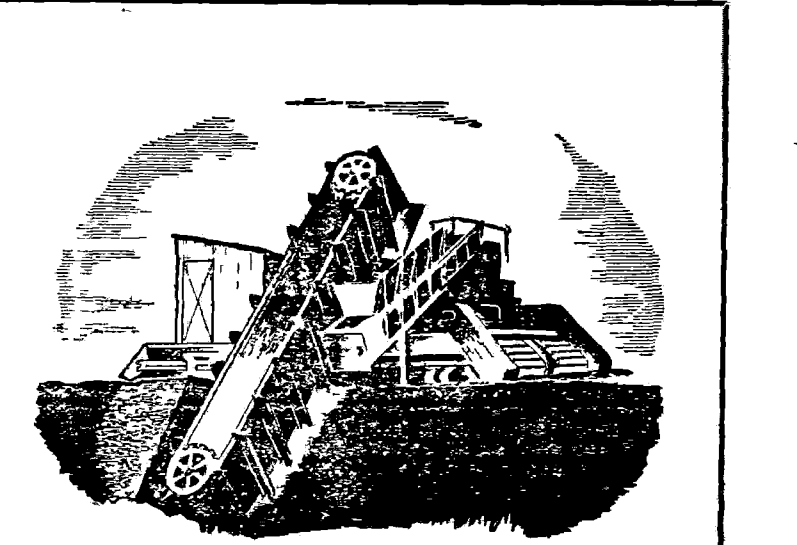

Motorist Exonerated.

At the District Court at Thurles on Wednesday the 4th January 1950, Michael Sargent (Junior) of Cappoquin was charged by the Attorney General under Section 50 and 51 of the Road Traffic Act in respect of an accident at Cookin Littleton Co. Tipperary after hearing the evidence in detail of Garda Two-mey Sergt Whitty, Sergt McKenna and other witnesses and on hearing Mr P J Morrissey, Dunganvar and Mr Morrissey, the District Justice agreed with Mr Morrissey's contention that Mr Sargent had no case what-so-ever to meet and that he would not be called on to give evidence. The District Justice in the detailed statement made by the defendant to Sergt McKenna was completely corroborated and borne out in detail by all the evidence given in the case and the Court was satisfied that it was correct. The court was satisfied that the man who was knocked down by the motor car driven by Mr Sargent was an innocent pedestrian and road and stepped out directly in front of the extreme end of the car which was being driven at the time of the accident in a slow and most careful manner within 2 feet of its own side of the road. There was no criminal liability whatever on the part of defendant. The District Justice stated that if there was to be a moral gain from the case it was to "reiterate that pedestrians cannot be too careful, they need not have any light or identity at night time. No drivers may not be one-half or one-third as careful as the defendant was in this case and this accident was due solely to the man who was knocked down by the defendant's car."
